

INITIAL RULE IMPACT STATEMENT

TITLE 310. OKLAHOMA STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH CHAPTER 250. FEE SCHEDULE FOR CONSUMER HEALTH

1. **DESCRIPTION:**

Fee requirements for pools are being moved out of Chapter 250 to a new, centralized chapter of rule containing all regulation for public pools and spas. This new chapter of rule will align with 63 O.S. § 1-1022, a new statute effective 11-1-24, prompted by HB4035 of the 2024 legislative session.

2. **DESCRIPTION OF PERSONS AFFECTED AND COST IMPACT RESPONSE:**

The persons or businesses applying for public pool licenses will be affected. All regulation for applicants will be in one, centralized chapter once changes take effect.

3. **DESCRIPTION OF PERSONS BENEFITING, VALUE OF BENEFIT AND EXPECTED HEALTH OUTCOMES:**

There are no expected health outcomes affiliated with the relocation of licensure fees. Applicants for licensure will benefit from the consolidation of license requirements, including fees into one chapter to facilitate ease of compliance.

4. **ECONOMIC IMPACT, COST OF COMPLIANCE, AND FEE CHANGES:**

There are no anticipated economic impacts or costs for compliance.

5. **COST AND BENEFITS OF IMPLEMENTATION AND ENFORCEMENT TO THE AGENCY:**

There will be administrative benefits over time, with the consolidation of regulations into one chapter. There are no anticipated costs for implementation or enforcement.

6. **IMPACT ON POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS:**

There are no anticipated impacts on political subdivisions.

7. **ADVERSE EFFECT ON SMALL BUSINESS:**

There are no adverse effects anticipated on small business.

8. **EFFORTS TO MINIMIZE COSTS OF THE RULE:**

There are no less costly means currently identified.

9. **EFFECT ON PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY:**

There are no anticipated effects on public health and safety. However, it is anticipated that regulated entities will have a better understanding of regulation requirements.

There are no anticipated detrimental effects on public health and safety.
