INITIAL RULE IMPACT STATEMENT

TITLE 310. OKLAHOMA STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH CHAPTER 675. NURSING AND SPECIALIZED FACILITIES

1. **DESCRIPTION:**

Proposed changes include amending language to align with updates to 63 O.S. § 1-1950.1. The rule proposal also clarifies the ability of certain staff in relation to the reconstitution of medication, removing unnecessary barriers to care, based on standards of care and industry collaboration.

2. <u>DESCRIPTION OF PERSONS AFFECTED AND COST IMPACT RESPONSE:</u>

This proposed rule impacts employees of licensed nursing and specialized facilities related to background check requirements. It also clarifies language related to the ability of a registered nurse and licensed practical nurse related to the reconstitution and dilution of medications previously labeled by a pharmacist.

3. <u>DESCRIPTION OF PERSONS BENEFITING, VALUE OF BENEFIT AND EXPECTED HEALTH OUTCOMES:</u>

Residents will benefit from the alignment of rule and statute as well as clarification related to the reconstitution of medication.
