
58% of deaths occurred at a home or apartment.

NON-HISPANIC AMERICAN INDIAN Creek County residents had the **highest** rate of death.

- Males were **2.7 times more likely** to die than females.
- Drug overdose **death rates increased 10%** from 20.3 per 100,000 (2012-2016) to 22.3 per 100,000 (2017-2021).
- **Nearly one in five (18%)** people who died had a history of mental health problems.
- Nearly three out of four (74%) people who died had a history of substance use.

- 55% of hospitalizations were unintentional and 42% due to self harm.
- Females were **30% more likely** to be hospitalized than males.
- Drug overdose **hospitalization rates decreased 21%** from 194.2 per 100,000 (2016-2018) to 152.6 per 100,000 (2019-2021).
- Non-Hispanic Black Creek County residents had the **highest rate** of hospitalizations.

The most common substances involved in hospitalizations were:

- Opioids
- Stimulants
- **▶** Antidepressants
- Non-opioid pain medications
- ▶ Hypnotics
