
55% of deaths occurred at a home or apartment.

NON-HISPANIC AMERICAN INDIAN Okmulgee County residents had the **highest** rate of death.

- Males were **51% more likely** to die than females.
- Drug overdose **death rates increased 27%** from 19.4 per 100,000 (2012-2016) to 24.7 per 100,000 (2017-2021).
- **Nearly one in four (23%)** people who died had a history of mental health problems.
- More than half (57%) of people who died had a history of substance use.

hospitalized for a nonfatal drug overdose from 2019-2021.

- **53**% of hospitalizations were unintentional and **45**% due to self harm.
- Females were **62% more likely** to be hospitalized than males.
- Drug overdose **hospitalization rates decreased 6%** from 152.4 per 100,000 (2016-2018) to 142.7 per 100,000 (2019-2021).
- Non-Hispanic White Okmulgee County residents had the **highest rate** of hospitalizations.

The most common substances involved in hospitalizations were:

- Opioids
- ▶ Stimulants
- ► Non-opioid pain medications
- **▶** Benzodiazepines
- **▶** Antidepressants
