Adults aged 35-44 years had the highest rate of death.


46% of deaths occurred at a home or apartment.

**NON-HISPANIC AMERICAN INDIAN** Pontotoc County residents had the highest rate of death.

- Females were 10% more likely to die than males.
- Drug overdose **death rates decreased 13%** from 16.7 per 100,000 (2012-2016) to 14.6 per 100,000 (2017-2021).
- One in four (25%) people who died had a history of mental health problems.
- Nearly two out of three (61%) people who died had a history of substance use.

DRUG OVERDOSE HOSPITALIZATIONS† (2019-2021)

Pontotoc County had the 27<sup>th</sup> highest nonfatal drug overdose hospitalization rate in the state.

hospitalized for a nonfatal drug overdose from 2019-2021.

- 56% of hospitalizations were unintentional and 41% due to self harm.
- Females were **68% more likely** to be hospitalized than males.
- Drug overdose **hospitalization rates decreased 11%** from 105.1 per 100,000 (2016-2018) to 94 per 100,000 (2019-2021).
- Non-Hispanic White Pontotoc County residents had the **highest rate** of hospitalizations.

The most common substances involved in hospitalizations were:

- Opioids
- Stimulants
- ▶ Antipsychotics
- ► Non-opioid pain medications
- **▶** Antidepressants
