59% of deaths occurred at a home or apartment.

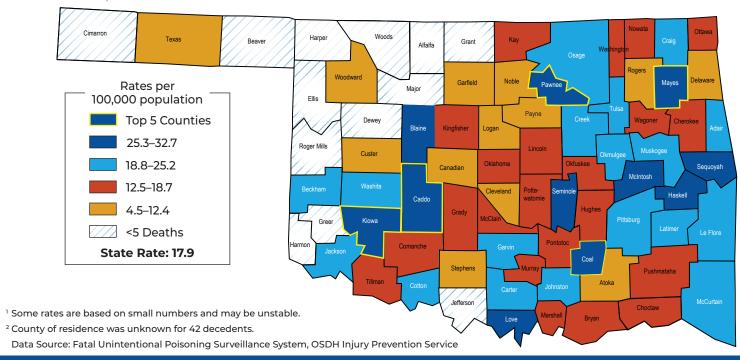
NON-HISPANIC BLACK

Seminole County residents had the **highest** rate of death.

- Males were **52% more likely** to die than females.
- Drug overdose **death rates increased 45%** from 18.1 per 100,000 (2012-2016) to 26.3 per 100,000 (2017-2021).
- **Half of people** who died had a history of substance use.

■ 47% of hospitalizations were unintentional and 49% due to self harm.

- Females were **2.3 times more likely** to be hospitalized than males.
- Drug overdose **hospitalization rates decreased 19**% from 134.1 per 100,000 (2016-2018) to 108.1 per 100,000 (2019-2021).
- Non-Hispanic White Seminole County residents had the **highest rate** of hospitalizations.

The most common substances involved in hospitalizations were:

- Antidepressants
- **▶** Benzodiazepines
- ▶ Antipsychotics
- ▶ Opioids
- **▶** Stimulants
