TEN THINGS to know about USING A CONDOM (correctly)

To begin with, plan ahead and have condoms with you if you think you might want to have sex. Don't rely on your partner to have condoms.

Check the expiration date (yes, they have them). If it is past the date, throw out the condom and get a new one.

Store condoms in a cool, dry place, like a dresser drawer. Don't leave condoms in hot places like your wallet or in your car. Open the condom carefully, so
you don't tear it. It's very easy to tear the condom inside, so don't use your fingernails or teeth when opening the wrapper. If you do



tear a condom while opening it, throw that condom away and get a new one.

Put the condom on an erect (hard) penis BEFORE there is ANY contact with a partner's genitals (BEFORE the penis touches the vagina, mouth or anus.)

When putting the condom on an erect penis, be sure to hold the condom by the tip to squeeze out the air. Leave some space at the tip to hold the ejaculate (cum).

If you start to unroll the condom the wrong way on the penis, take it off, throw it away, and get a new condom. **DON'T** flip the condom over and re-roll it on the penis.

After sex, be sure to hold the condom in place at the base of the penis before withdrawing (pulling out).

 Always throw the
condom away after it has been used. NEVER reuse a condom.
