Dear Long Term Care Facility,

Prolonged physical separation from family and loved ones, an integral piece to the physical and psychosocial well-being of residents, has negative effects on residents and is recognized by State and Federal visitation guidance.

Current guidance has set expectations of the need, and priority, for residents to resume the ability to have visitation. Facilities should allow indoor and outdoor visitation at all times, for all residents (regardless of vaccination status), with the exception of a few circumstances.

This guidance has been prompted to remove restrictions on visitation for all Long Term Care residents. It is important to take a person-centered approach to visitation, and to identify how to facilitate the opportunity for residents to have contact that is beneficial to their well-being. Facilities must also consider compassionate care needs, which extend beyond end-of-life needs.

Eligible Federal and State Long Term Care facilities that agree to both Federal and State visitation guidelines have received add-on payments from the Oklahoma Health Care Authority. One of the attestations required for those payments included a commitment to meeting the visitation standards established by surveying entities.

Please note that Governor Stitt terminated his declaration of the public health emergency removing COVID-19 restrictions in the state of Oklahoma. In addition, he signed into law <u>HB2566</u>, which requires facilities to provide reasonable access to residents and prohibits unilateral denial of visitation. The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services has also acknowledged the significance of resident visitation, per <u>QSO-20-39-NH</u> (issued 04/27/2021), and <u>QSO-21-14-ICF/IID & PRTF</u> (issued 06/03/2021).
