Of the 19 FQHCs in Oklahoma, 14 entered into a contract with the OSDH for assistance with uncompensated care costs incurred for providing primary care, dental, or behavioral health services to the uninsured. Of these 14 FQHCs, 11 submitted invoices, and of these 11, only 4 FQHCs were determined to be eligible for UCF assistance.




