HB2582 -- Oklahoma Long Term Care National Background Check Program

63 OS § 1-1945 et seq.

Benefits:

- By this measure, we take a decisive step to stop those who might abuse, neglect or financially exploit our most vulnerable citizens
- Provides through fingerprinting a comprehensive criminal history records search of national and state criminal history records not available under our previous name based records search
- Uses web based technologies to provide employers a single portal for checking state and national abuse registries and the national sex offender registry
- Relies on new technology to monitor criminal histories and alert officials when a change in criminal history occurs
- A monitored criminal history record means the cost of re-fingerprinting is not required for employees who change employers in this industry and allows immediate eligibility determinations for enrolled applicants and employers
- Provides an efficient and effective means for an employer to check an applicant's status prior to paying the cost of criminal history monitoring enrollment
- The Health Department will share with sister agencies in the development and expansion of a statewide network of sites using digital imaging technology to collect fingerprints, yielding more reliable fingerprints the first time, reducing delays in processing, and inconvenience to applicants
- Shared fingerprinting sites means greater access for teachers, nurses, and child-care service workers, also subject to fingerprinting requirements
- Shared contracting with a fingerprinting vendor keeps fingerprinting costs lower for our state
- Limits the ability of bad actors to hide their criminal or abusive actions by crossing state lines
- Ensure applicants are not misidentified and barred from gainful employment based on name based searches
- In most cases, criminal history monitoring enrollment will be cost neutral to providers through the use of minimized re-fingerprinting, grant start-up funds and leveraged Medicaid Funds
