

**Minutes of the  
Oklahoma Corporation Commission  
State of Oklahoma**

**February 10, 2022 – 9:30 a.m.**

These are the minutes for the Corporation Commission’s (“Commission”) regular meeting conducted February 10, 2022, in accordance with the Open Meeting Act. The audio was recorded in Room 301 of the Commission’s principal offices at 2101 North Lincoln Boulevard, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma 73105. Archived Commission meeting recordings may be accessed on the Commission’s website.

The notice and agenda for the meeting were publicly posted at the Oklahoma City offices of the Commission at 9:15 a.m. February 9, 2022, by Commission employees acting under the direction of the Judicial and Legal Services Division. The notice and agenda are also made available to the public on the Commission’s website. A copy of the notice and agenda is attached to these minutes as Appendix A.

Chairman Murphy called the meeting to order at 9:32 a.m.

**Call to Order, Announcement Concerning Public Notice and Determination of Quorum** Members present in Room 301 were Chairman Dana Murphy, Vice Chairman Bob Anthony and Commissioner Todd Hiatt. A quorum of the Commission was present. Interested parties participated in person or by teleconference/videoconference.

**Consideration of Proposed or Potential Orders in Causes on Daily Signing Agenda Docket** The daily signing agenda of proposed orders in judicial cases was presented by Peggy Mitchell, commission secretary. The Commissioners approved the proposed orders (through a **roll call vote**) with the exception of CD 202102456, CD 202102477 and CD 202102720, which were stricken; and Commissioner Murphy did not participate in EN 202100231.

**Consideration of Proposed or Potential Orders in Causes on 24-hour Signing Agenda Docket** The 24-hour signing agenda of proposed orders was presented by Ms. Mitchell. Discussion was held. The Commissioners approved (through a **roll call vote**) the proposed orders with the exception of PUD 202100164, which was stricken and Commissioner Anthony did not participate in the Order Granting Limited Intervention and Denying Protective Order, and the Final Order Closing Cause in PUD 202200003.


