These are the minutes for the Corporation Commission's ("Commission") regular meeting conducted in accordance with the Open Meeting Act on August 7, 2024, in the Concourse Theater, Suite C50, Will Rogers Memorial Office Building, 2401 North Lincoln Boulevard, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma 73105. Archived Commission meeting recordings may be accessed on the Commission's website.

The notice and agenda for the meeting were publicly posted at the principal office of the Commission at the Will Rogers Memorial Office Building, 2401 North Lincoln Boulevard, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma 73105 at 3:45 p.m., August 5, 2024, by Commission employees acting under the direction of Chairman Todd Hiett. The notice and agenda are also made available to the public on the Commission's website, oklahoma.gov/occ. A copy of the notice and agenda is attached to these minutes as Appendix A.

Chairman Hiett called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m.

Members present were Chairman J. Todd Hiett, Vice Chairman Kim David, and Commissioner Bob Anthony. A quorum of the Commission was present. Interested persons participated in the meeting in person or by teleconference/videoconference when and as authorized.

Consideration of proposed or potential orders in cases on daily signing agenda docket. The Commission may discuss and consider alterations, revisions, or amendments to the proposed or potential orders. (Votes may be taken on individual cases, on the daily signing agenda docket as a whole, or both by individual cases and the remaining docket. The vote on daily signing agenda cases may be combined with the vote on 24-hour signing agenda cases.) Commissioner Hiett announced the agenda item and CALLED FOR A VOTE on the proposed orders on the daily signing agenda docket. The Commissioners unanimously approved all orders with the exception of SF2024-000006, SF2024-000007, and SF2024-000008, in which Commissioner Hiett did not participate.

Consideration of proposed or potential orders in cases on attached 24-hour signing agenda docket. The Commission may discuss and consider alterations, revisions, or amendments to the proposed or potential orders. (Votes may be taken on individual cases on the 24-hour signing agenda docket as a whole, or both by individual cases and the remaining docket.) Commissioner Hiett announced the agenda item and stated that the proposed order for PUD2024-000010 would be taken up separately from the balance of the items on the 24-hour signing agenda. The Commissioners unanimously approved all orders with the exception of that for PUD2024-000010, which would be considered separately. Commissioner Hiett recommended that the proposed order for PUD2024-000010 be stricken because it was inadvertently set due to pending exceptions. Discussion was held. - <u>immediately refer any and all evidence of unlawful activity to proper law</u> <u>enforcement authorities:</u>
- demand the full cooperation of all agency staff, upon pain of discipline or dismissal for non-cooperation, evasion, impediment or concealment, excepting the exercise of their 5th Amendment right against selfincrimination, invocation of which shall be noted, unredacted, in the final report;
- include unrestricted, expedited access to all potentially-relevant agency records;
- include an unrestricted, expedited Records Request to all agency personnel for all relevant records, information or evidence which shall be provided directly to investigators;
- <u>include a public call requesting the cooperation of all other agencies and</u> <u>branches of state government as well as members of the public with relevant</u> <u>information or evidence:</u>
- <u>confer</u>, <u>or</u> <u>otherwise</u> <u>authorize</u> <u>investigators</u> <u>to</u> <u>use</u>, <u>the</u> <u>agency/commissioners'</u> <u>constitutional</u> <u>and</u> <u>statutory</u> <u>authorities</u> <u>to</u> <u>compel</u> <u>relevant</u> <u>records</u> <u>and/or</u> <u>testimony</u> <u>from</u> <u>all</u> <u>transportation</u> <u>and</u> <u>transmission</u> <u>companies</u>, <u>railroad</u> <u>companies</u>, <u>public</u> <u>service</u> <u>companies</u>, <u>or</u> <u>other</u> <u>corporations</u> <u>within</u> <u>the</u> <u>jurisdiction</u> <u>of</u> <u>the</u> <u>Commission</u>, <u>and</u> <u>any</u> <u>officer</u>, <u>agent</u>, <u>or</u> <u>employee</u> <u>thereof</u>;

- <u>include monthly public status reports at open Commission meetings by</u> <u>investigators or their designated representative(s);</u>
- <u>be authorized initially to expend up to \$50,000, and to request further funding</u> <u>as investigators may believe necessary to conduct a full, thorough</u> <u>investigation.</u>

Commissioner David announced the agenda item and deferred to Commissioner Anthony to present this item. Discussion was held. Commissioner David recognized Brandy Wreath, director of administration, to provide a status update on an independent investigation. No votes or actions were taken on this item.
