




Oklahoma Schools Eligible Bandwidth Fund Year 2023/24 Targets

Oklahoma Law



17 O.S. Section 139.109.1 (A)(2) requires the provision of bandwidth sufficient for providing educational services not to exceed, without good cause shown, the standards established for the relevant funding year by the State Educational Technology Directors Association (SETDA). In the absence of standards prescribed for the applicable funding year, the standards for the next prescribed funding shall be used.



SETDA Recommendation



The SETDA recommendation in Broadband Imperative III provides a recommendation based on studies of bandwidth use in schools related to changes in technology and the expanded use of state and regional networks, as well as growth charts with projections for fund year 2023/24.

Since Oklahoma does not utilize either state or regional networks, we will use the growth charts found in the Broadband Imperative III, Appendix A, starting on page 22, to comply with the Oklahoma statutes starting with fund year 2021/22 as seen on the following slide.

Eligible Internet Bandwidth – Oklahoma Schools



The 2023/24 targets for Oklahoma Schools are the same as last year as shown below.

INTERNET BANDWIDTH RECOMMENDATIONS	
School District Size	2023-24 Targets
Small School District (fewer than 1,000 students)	At least 4.3 Mbps per user (Minimum 300 Mbps for district)
Medium School District Size (3,000 students)	At least 3.0 Gbps per 1000 users
Large School District (more than 10,000 students)	At least 2.0 Gbps per 1000 users

User = students, teachers, administrators, staff, and guests

Eligible WAN Service – Oklahoma Schools



Eligible WAN bandwidth for schools also remains the same as last year.

WAN RECOMMENDATIONS	
School Districts	2023-24 Targets
Connections to each school to link to the internet via a district aggregation point and for in-house administrative functions	At least 10 Gbps per 1,000 users
User = students, teachers, administrators, staff, and guests. District-wide based on WAN site with largest number of users.
