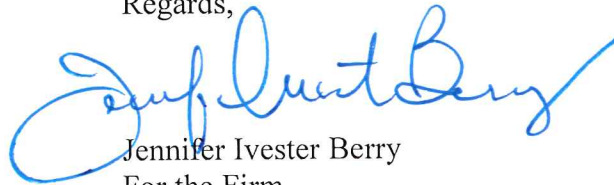

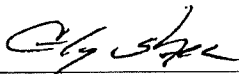

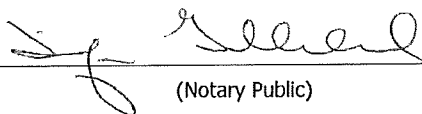

NOTICE OF INTENT TO CONSTRUCT

In order to comply with the requirements of title 17 O.S. § 160.11 et. seq., and the rules promulgated by the Oklahoma Corporation Commission ("Commission") hereunder, Rock Falls Wind Farm, LLC, a Delaware limited liability company (the "Company") hereby informs the Commission of its intent to construct the Rock Falls wind energy project (the "Project") located in Grant and Kay Counties, Oklahoma.

The Project has been under active development since 2015. The most recent FAA Form 7460-1 filings were made on November 28, 2016. A summary of the FAA Form 7460-1 filings for the 62 turbines included in the Project, as well as for 3 alternative turbine sites ("Alternative Turbines"), is attached hereto as Exhibit A. In the event any designs and plans are developed that will utilize the Alternative Turbines, the Company will provide notice of the same to the Commission.

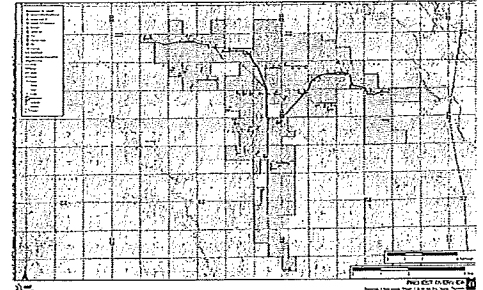

EPA Head's Emails With Energy Companies To Be Released

OKLAHOMA CITY (AP) — The Oklahoma attorney general's office said Tuesday it is complying with a judge's order to surrender documents related to new Environmental Protection Agency leader Scott Pruitt's communications with energy companies while he served as the state's attorney general.

The office had until 5 p.m. Tuesday to comply with District Judge Alex Hooten's order. Timmons' order to turn over emails and other documents to the Wisconsin-based Center for Media and Democracy, which requested the documents more than two years ago under Oklahoma's Open Records Act.

A spokesman for the office, Lincoln Ferguson, said the turned over records related to the January 2015 request to the watching agency and that other records were turned over to the judge to determine if they are being sought subject to release under the law.

The office went above and beyond what is required under the Open Records Act and produced thousands of additional documents that, but for the court's order, would typically be considered records outside the scope of the act, Ferguson said in an emailed statement.

This broad disclosure should provide affirmation that, despite politically motivated allegations, the office of attorney general remains fully committed to the letter and spirit of the Open Records Act, Ferguson said.

An attorney for the attorney general, Bob Nelson, said he received an email from the attorney general's office at 4:14 p.m. Tuesday indicating that it planned to comply with the judge's order and make the documents available.

Nelson said the records were provided electronically and that an initial review indicated the group in 2015 and 2016. The judge handed down her ruling on Thursday in connection with a lawsuit the group filed that accused the attorney general's office of failing to provide "prompt and reasonable access" to the documents as required by the Open Records Act.

Pruitt resigned his post as Oklahoma attorney general on Friday, the day he was sworn in as President Donald Trump's EPA administrator. Among other things, the January 2015 request sought information about Pruitt's communications with energy companies and relationships with fossil fuel companies as the state's attorney general, companies he will help regulate as EPA administrator.

Required whelping permits have reduced over-breeding. A whelping permit is required inside the city limits within 10 days of the birth of each litter, 25 percent of puppies or kittens with female dogs and cats limited to one litter per year.

California Dams Overflow; Floods Likely

MODESTO, Calif. (AP) — Communities downstream from a Northern California reservoir gushing water for the first time in 20 years braced for flash floods and evacuations after authorities warned them to prepare for rising rivers and creeks.

Northern California is forecast to get a brief but heavy rain on Wednesday, but the surge of water released from Don Pedro Dam into the Tuolumne River in the foothills east of Modesto is expected to reach overtopped levees later in the day.

Katie Whitley, who manages the Driftwood Mobile Home Park in Modesto, said residents nearest the river have been moving their trailers out since the start of the weekend.

"We're just holding our own," Whitley told the Los Angeles Times. "That's what we have to do. You just have to hope for the best. But you can expect it when you live on the river."

The water released from Don Pedro is expected to reach its peak along a stretch near Vernonia that's already at danger stage, said Tim Daly, a spokesman for the Stanislaus County Office of Emergency Services. The water isn't expected to spill over the levees but rather increase pressure on them, causing possible breaks in any weak places.

Farther south, the Anderson Dam in Santa Clara County reached capacity early in the weekend and after heavy rain it began overflowing into the Los Angeles River.
