RE: Proof of Publication and Public Information Meeting for a Wind Farm in Texas County, OK

Dear Commission:

Pursuant to the Oklahoma Wind Energy Development Act, as amended in 2015 by SB NO 808, 17 Okla. Stat. § 160 et seq. this is a demonstration of compliance with public notice and public information meeting requirements for Phase 1 of the Firewheel Renewable Energy, LLC (Firewheel) wind project. The Project site is located in southeastern Texas County, Oklahoma. Phase I of the Project will consist of up to 200 wind turbine generators and associated facilities. Firewheel attests that the Project design complies with the setbacks required by the Wind Energy Development Act.

Notice of Firewheel's initial filing with the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) was provided to the Oklahoma Corporation Commission (OCC) on February 11, 2016, and to Texas County the following day. Notices of a public information meeting were published in the Guymon Daily Herald on June 11 and 18; and in the Hooker Advance on June 9 and 16, all within the required six-month window from the OCC notice. Copies of the newspaper pages on which the notice appeared are provided in Exhibit A.

Firewheel hosted a public information meeting at the Guymon Public Library on June 21, 2016. An estimated 40 to 50 area residents attended. Five Firewheel representatives were on hand to discuss the project development. Four posters were presented to show the turbine locations as filed with FAA and as currently micro-sited; to show leased lands; to highlight environmental constraints; and to summarize wildlife survey and impact avoidance efforts. Reduced-size copies of these posters are provided in Exhibit B. Photos of the event are provided in Exhibit C.

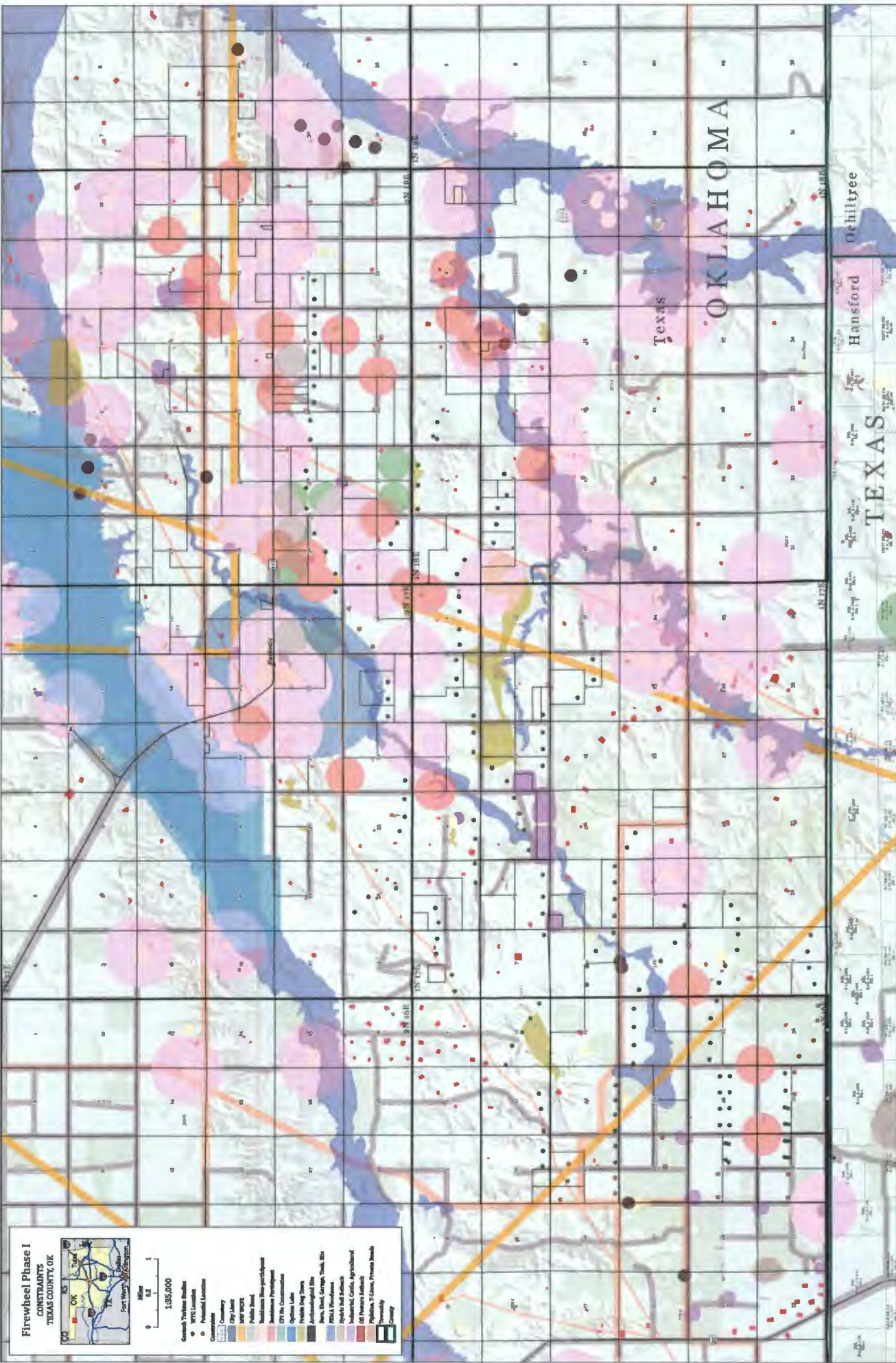

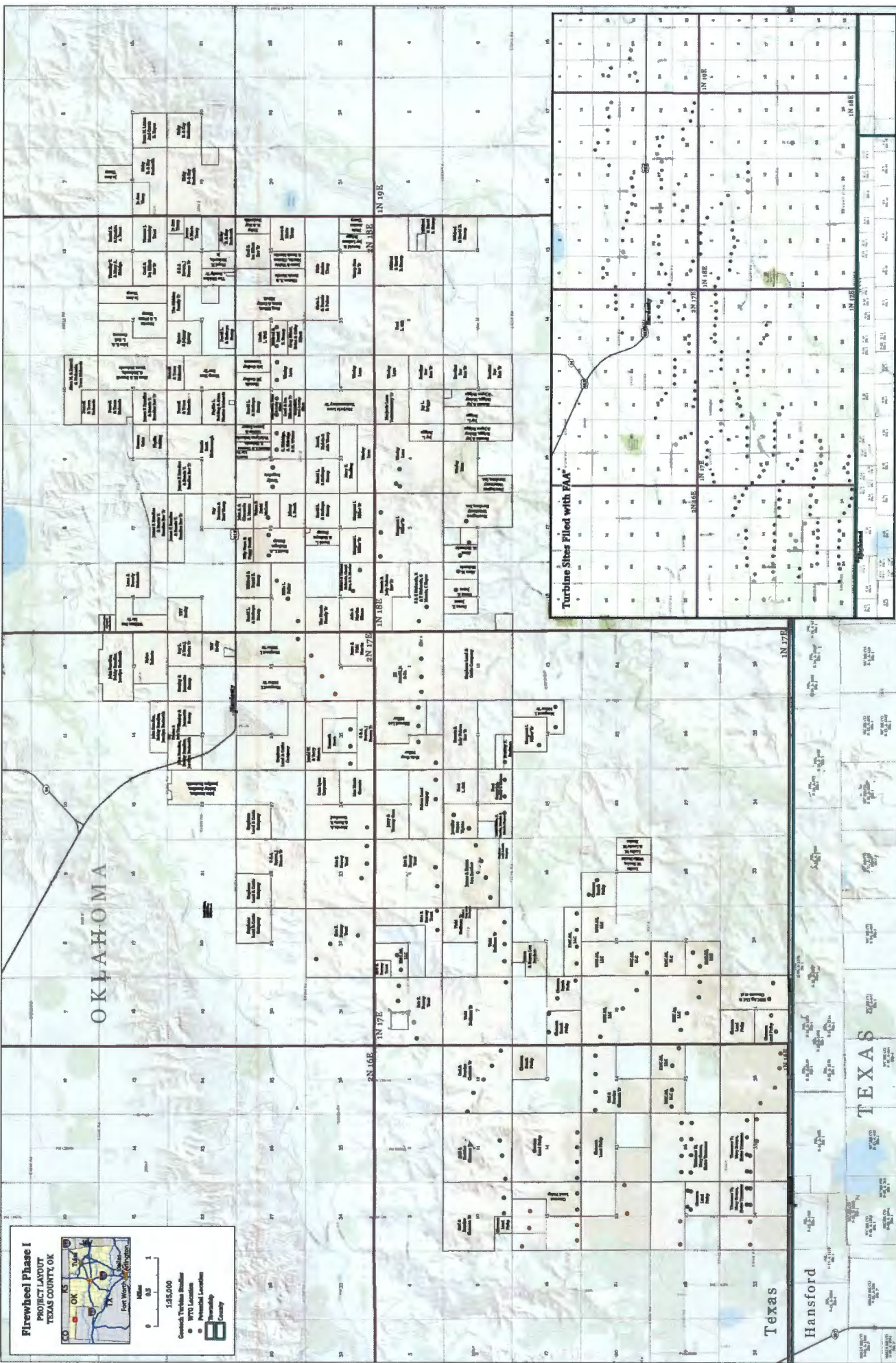

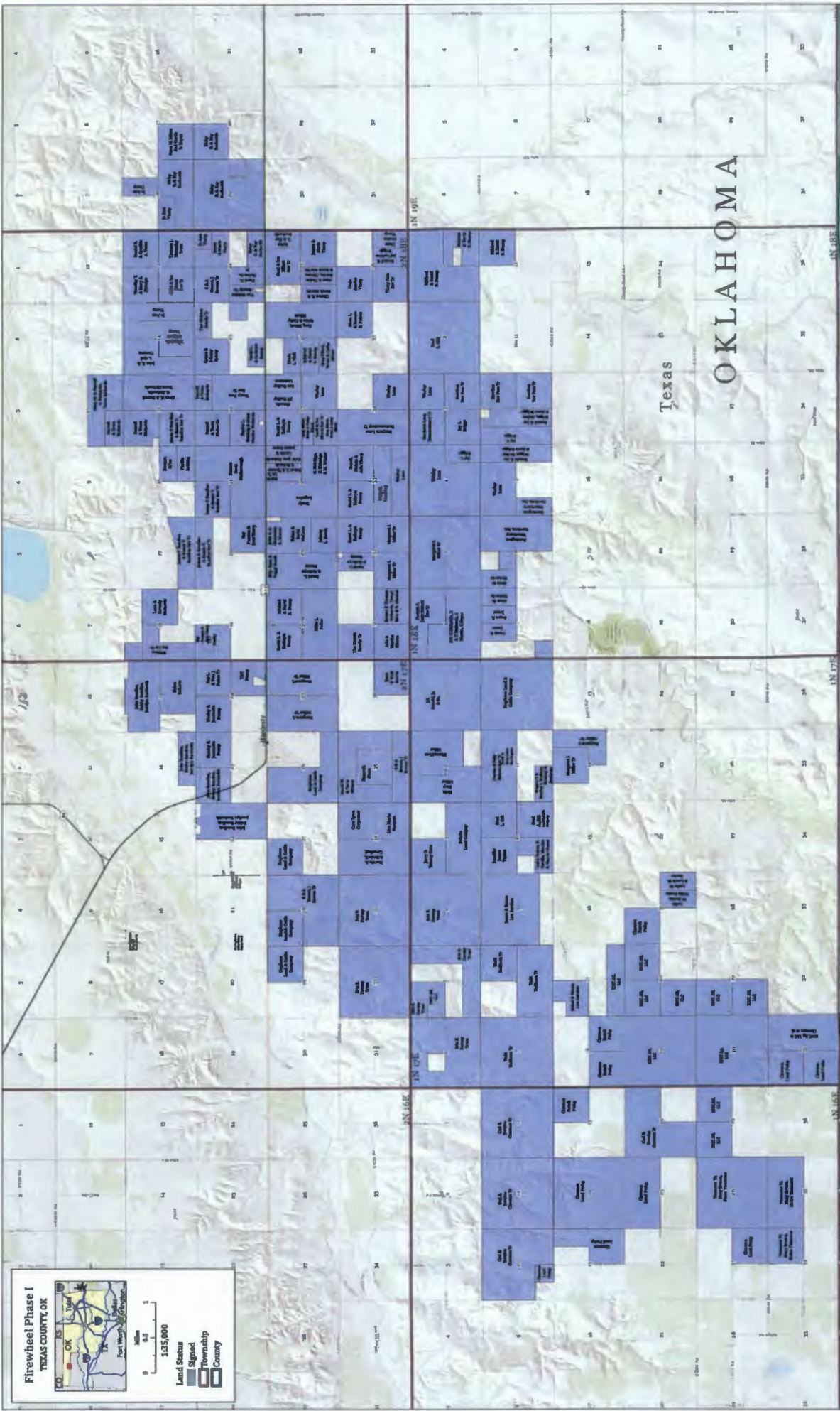

- Eagle/Avian Use Surveys
 - 6 Seasons of survey work
 - 34 survey points
 - Low use by eagles, primarily in winter, which is typical
 - Bird species observed typical for region (e.g., Sandhill crane, horned lark and Canada goose)
- Raptor/Eagle Nest Surveys
 - Year 1
 - Aerial survey with ground follow-up performed for project area plus 1-mile buffer
 - 33 raptor nests identified, including Swainson's hawk, red-tailed hawk and great-horned owl.

 - No LEPC leks or incidental observations of individuals were documented.

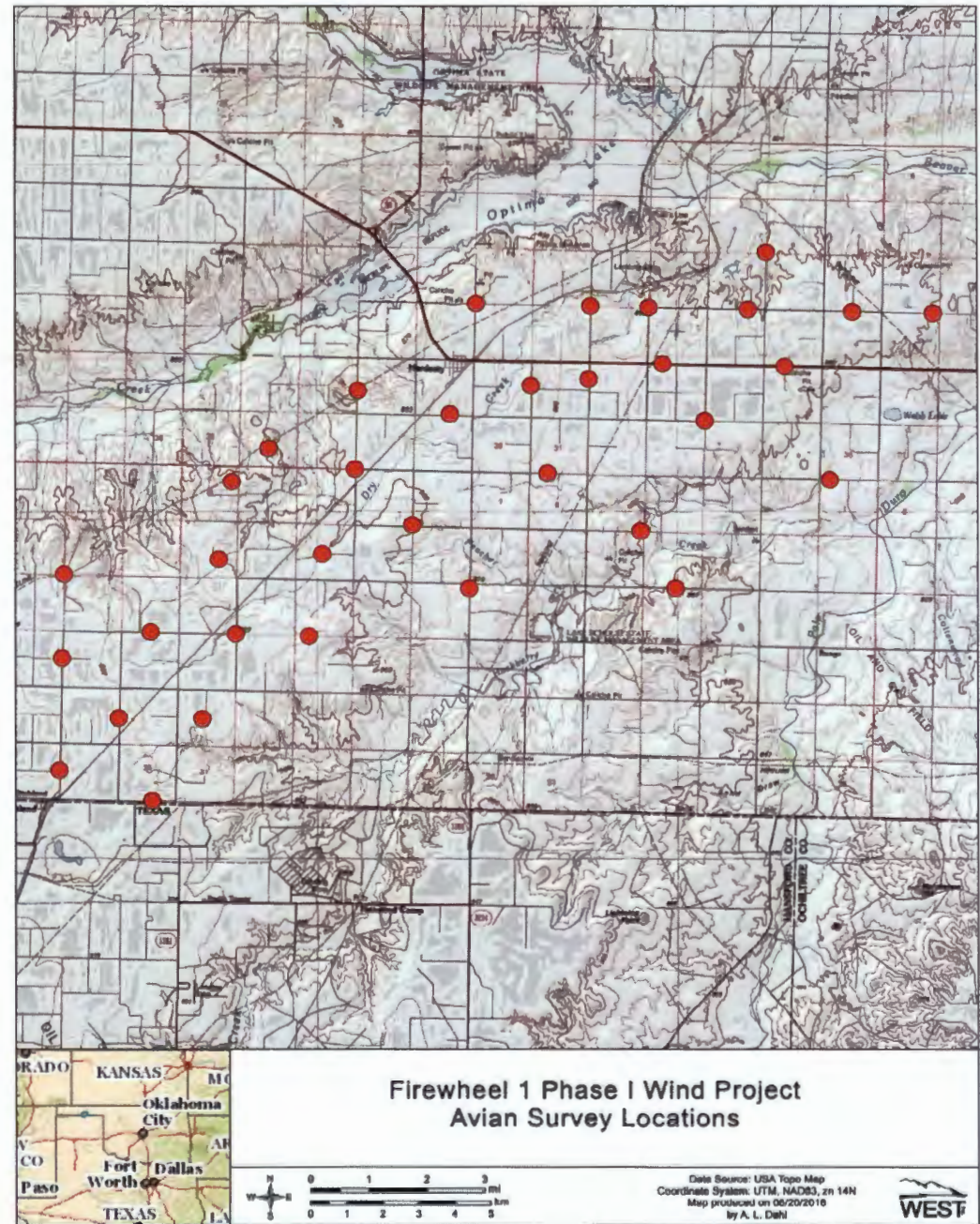
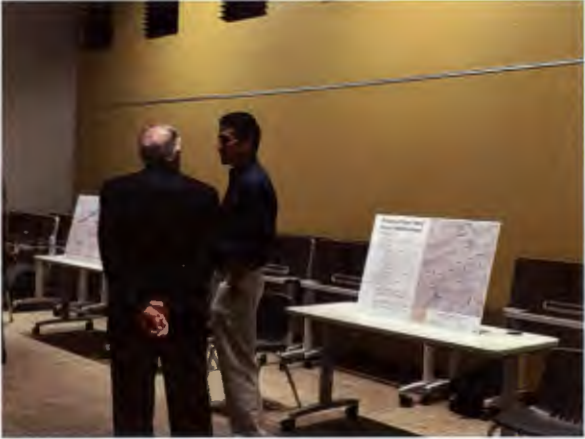

TCEC Member Advisory: Cool off electricity use with energy saving

Summer forecast predicts hotter than normal conditions. With temperatures rising, air conditioners are kicking on causing higher electricity use. That translates to higher electric bills. Tri-County Electric Cooperative (TCEC) reminds members the cooperative has tools to help members monitor their energy use and find energy saving tips.

"We have not changed our rates," said Zac Perkins, TCEC chief executive officer. "The biggest factor affecting a member's bill is how much electricity they use and we're here to help them manage that if they like."

TCEC has an online portal at www.tcec.com that offers hourly charts showing energy use that can help members track their energy use. Members can also view their daily energy use via the free TCEC Mobile app. By using these near real-time tools rather than waiting for a monthly bill, members can take control of their energy use when it is occurring.

To help figure out where their dollars are going, members can take the virtual home tour at www.TogetherWeSave.com or download the free

TogetherWeSave.com app with many lightbulb and appliance calculators. During the virtual tour, members will "walk" through a home's family room, kitchen, laundry room, bedroom, basement and attic. Each area reveals at least two actions to improve a home's energy efficiency. As the member moves through the room and completes the suggested changes, a running tally of potential energy dollar savings shows on the screen.

to reduce summer electricity use. Install a programmable thermostat and use it to increase the thermostat when away from home. Set the thermostat to 78 degrees when home for optimal efficiency. Use ceiling fans whenever possible. Seal air leaks by caulking around windows. Use cold water to wash clothes and line dry them instead of using the dryer when possible. Remember to unplug electric chargers, televi-

"When we start to talk to them about the issues that the Democrats have with the Republicans, they agree with us. Almost every time, they have agreed with us. So it is time that we have more of a Democratic representation out here in the panhandle."

Setzer added that there is one democrat on the ballot for representative for Oklahoma District 61, Ashlee Ortiz. He urged Democrats to make the push to back Ortiz.

Committee member John Schmidt said he wants to see the group

push for Democratic ideals, rather than pushing a fear of a Trump presidency, noting that he is "tired" of fear mongering tactics to garner votes. "It's certainly important to (make) that distinction that I would like the Democratic party to say this is what we stand for, here's our principles," Schmidt said. Setzer agreed with the sentiment, but added that he feels the focus of the Texas County Democrats should be on local elections and politics, and that the push for this election cycle should be to back Ortiz.

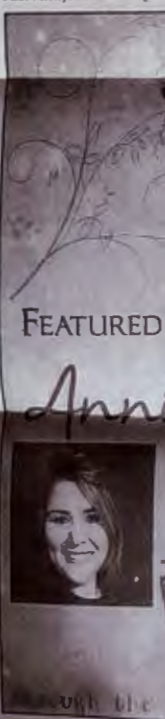
