12: Promises is the follow-up documentary to the powerful 2008 film **12: Is There Life After Rehab in Recovery?** Research reveals that by age 12, many of our youth have started experimenting with drugs and alcohol. By age 16, almost twenty percent are drinking and/or using substances to the level of addiction. Both films feature honest, peer-to-peer testimonials of surviving those years and demonstrating that the sacrifices of recovery are worth it. **12: Promises** examines the next step strategies and solutions to the problems confronting teens as they transition from the first steps of recovery into reestablishing their lives. The screenings will be followed by a moderated panel discussion of distinguished specialists and 12 cast members – young people in long term recovery.
