INTRODUCTION/REGULATIONS

The Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) is committed to ensuring that strategic plans are in place to assist in the participation by Limited English Proficient (LEP) persons with regard to the ODOT's programs, services, or activities. The ODOT strives to develop goals and objectives that address meaningful access for all people the agency serves and encounters, including those who are LEP persons.

This document is guided by the requirements of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, and Title VI regulations, as set forth in guidance memoranda from the US Department of Justice (DOJ), Civil Rights Division. (See e.g., 65 FR 50123 (August 16, 2000), and 67 FR 41466 (June 18, 2002), also available at www.lep.gov.

Executive Order No. 13166 "Improving Access to Services for Persons with Limited English Proficiency" was created to "...improve access to federally conducted and federally assisted programs and activities for persons who, as a result of national origin, are limited in their English proficiency (LEP)..." The basis for EO 13166 is Section 601 of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, 42 USC 2000d, (hereinafter Title VI), which provides that no person shall "on the ground of race, color, or national origin, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance."

The ODOT Policy Directive B-306-6 titled "Discrimination/Federal Funding" (Appendix C) outlines LEP responsibilities of the agency and the Title VI Coordinator. An assessment is conducted periodically to determine the agency needs with regard to LEP encounters. The last LEP Assessment occurred in 2013. All divisions are notified of policies and procedures regarding the assistance of LEP persons and the reporting of all LEP encounters.

PURPOSE OF ASSESSMENT

The goal of this assessment is to accurately determine the needs of LEP persons that come into contact with the ODOT. The assessment data provides the necessary information to develop policies and procedures that ensure meaningful access to the ODOT's programs and activities by LEP persons. This assessment data includes population census data, analysis of historical LEP encounters, and analysis of important documents needed by the public to access the ODOT's programs and activities.

TITLE VI COORDINATOR

The Title VI Coordinator answers directly to the Civil Rights Division Manager and to the ODOT Executive Director on Title VI issues. The Title VI Coordinator has the responsibility for the strategic direction of ODOT's Title VI Program including program and activity delivery and oversight, evaluation of Title VI program activities and reports, community and interagency coordination, technical guidance and assistance, training, policy development and revision, and coordination of all agency-wide Title VI program implementation and information.

TITLE VI DESIGNEES

Each ODOT division (Central Office and Field) has a designee responsible for communicating and coordinating with the Title VI Coordinator on activities impacted by Title VI. These individuals are responsible for monitoring and implementing required policies and practices within his or her respective area(s) of responsibility, to ensure ODOT's programs, policies, procedures and practices are applied fairly, equitably, and in a nondiscriminatory manner in accordance with Title VI and the related nondiscrimination laws detailed earlier in this Plan. These individuals provide program activity information to the Title VI Coordinator upon request. The required accomplishment is monitored by the Title VI Coordinator. The Title VI Coordinator will schedule an annual meeting with each designee to make sure Title VI requirements and notices are in compliance. The Title VI designees will receive information via video or written materials to minimize travel for the field divisions. The role/responsibility of being a Title VI designee will fall under the category of "all other duties as assigned".

I. IDENTIFYING LEP INDIVIDUALS WHO NEED LANGUAGE ASSISTANCE

FOUR FACTOR ANALYSIS

Recipients are required to take reasonable steps to ensure meaningful access to their programs and activities by LEP persons. While designed to be a flexible and fact-dependent standard, the starting point is an individualized assessment that balances the following four-factors to determine oral language assistance:

1. The number or proportion of LEP persons eligible to be served or likely to be encountered by a program, activity, or service of the recipient or grantee;

Language data is analyzed from the US Census to determine the population of LEP persons geographically by the ODOT Divisions. There are 8 field divisions, each with specific counties within their jurisdiction. The Oklahoma City area is considered to be Central Office and is also referred to as Division 9. A map in Appendix A outlines the divisions and counties in each division. The demographic data by division is outlined below. Data charts are in Appendix B.

Here are the results by division and language using population numbers (2011-2015 US Bureau of the Census, American Community Survey Table B16001: LANGUAGE SPOKEN AT HOME BY ABILITY TO SPEAK ENGLISH FOR THE POPULATION 5 YEARS AND OVER) of the individuals 5 years and older that speak English "less than very well" using the criteria outlined in the section of this report titled "Safe Harbor" (1,000 or more persons or more than 5% of the population):

2. The frequency with which LEP individuals come in contact with the program;

The Title VI Coordinator provided training to all Title VI Designees and front desk personnel at all Central Office Divisions, Field Division Headquarters, and all Residencies. The training was accomplished for each division between the dates of March 8, 2019, through April 30, 2019. The training during this specific time period was to distribute and explain the new LEP Guidebook (Appendix D).

During this training, each person in attendance was interviewed to discuss their individual experiences regarding LEP encounters. Each person interviewed was asked to specifically outline any and all LEP encounters they could recall in the past three years (for example if a person was interviewed on April 17, 2019, they were asked about the time frame of April 17, 2016, through the present day). Prior to this training, designees and front desk personnel may not have known this was something they needed to track. Also there may have been changes to these positions

and other personnel that may have occupied these positions in the past were not interviewed. Going forward all personnel are aware of the need to track all LEP encounters and report them to the Title VI Coordinator of the Civil Rights Division within three (3) business days.

The training provided an LEP Guidebook (Appendix D) which included forms for reporting all future LEP encounters so that the ODOT can continue ongoing analysis of LEP needs based on future encounters.

3. The nature and importance of the program, activity, or service provided by the recipient to people's lives; and

The planning of projects and public meetings held about those projects always take into account the population to be impacted by that particular project. Those can have great impact, especially when homes and business are involved in the path of a project. Analysis of the population always looks at languages spoken to assess oral interpretation and written translation needs. All notices for public meetings include instructions for participants to request accommodations 72 hours prior to the meeting using the "Public Meeting Accessibility Notice":

Public Meeting Accessibility Notice

In accordance with the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) will not and does not discriminate against qualified individuals with disabilities on the basis of disability in ODOT services, programs, activities, or employment practices. ODOT will provide reasonable accommodations for persons with disabilities, upon request. To request an accommodation, please contact the ADA/504/508 Coordinator at 405-521-4140 or Oklahoma Relay at 1-800-722-0353, no later than 72 hours before any scheduled event.

This is done on a project by project basis. All public meetings have a sign in sheet for participants to indicate their demographic information to provide additional information for the demographic analysis. Assistance may be provided at public meetings (such as translators) if the information regarding the area demographics indicate a significant non-English speaking population impacted by a project.

4. The resources available to the recipient and costs.

During the training of Title VI Designees regarding the LEP Guidebook, all personnel attending training were informed about a database of the ODOT interpreters and translators available to assist with an LEP person walking in or calling. They were informed where to find the database and given a current copy in the LEP Guidebook. If an ODOT employee is not available, each division has state contract information to contact and hire an interpreter or translator. Each department at the ODOT is responsible for the process and costs incurred with regard to the need for hiring an interpreter or translation of documents.

SAFE HARBOR

Written language assistance utilizes the "Safe Harbor" provisions. Failure to provide written translations outlined in the two paragraphs below does not mean there is noncompliance. Rather these are used for guidelines for recipients that would like greater certainty of compliance.

The following actions will be considered strong evidence of compliance with the recipient's written-translation obligations:

- The DOT recipient provides written translations of vital documents for each eligible LEP language group that constitutes 5% or 1,000, whichever is less, of the population of persons eligible to be served or likely to be affected or encountered. Translation of other documents, if needed, can be provided orally; or
- 2. If there are fewer than 50 persons in a language group that reaches the 5% trigger in Number 1, the recipient does not translate vital written materials but provides written notice in the primary language of the LEP language group of the right to receive competent oral interpretation of those written materials, free of cost.

These "Safe Harbor" provisions apply to the translation of written documents only. They do not affect the requirement to provide meaningful access to LEP individuals through competent oral interpreters where oral language services are needed and are reasonable.

Documents published by the ODOT are continuously monitored to determine if additional items need to be translated.

Based on the population numbers reaching the threshold, Division 9 will translate vital documents into Spanish, Vietnamese, Other Asian Languages, and Chinese.

II. LANGUAGE ASSISTANCE MEASURES

The ODOT has developed an LEP Guidebook that has been provided to all front desk personnel and designees from each Central Office Division, Field Division, and Residency. The guidebook outlines in detail how to handle LEP encounters in person, on the phone, or written requests for translations of documents. Forms are provided to report all LEP encounters for use in the future when updating the ODOT's LEP Assessment and Language Assistance Plan (LAP). The Guidebook includes an "I Speak" list of languages which were based on an analysis of three different state language lists and one national language list. The languages were listed in the order of population spoken in Oklahoma. The LEP Guidebook, which includes the "I Speak" list, is in Appendix D.

III. TRAINING STAFF

During March and April of 2019, the Title VI Coordinator provided LEP training to all Title VI designees and front desk personnel for all Central Office Divisions, all field division headquarters, and all residency locations. During the training the Title VI Designees and front desk personnel were given LEP Guidebooks to refer to as its use and function was explained, page by page. The training explained Title VI responsibilities in general, and LEP responsibilities specifically. The Title VI Coordinator will provide mandatory training every quarter for Title VI Designees, rotating between odd and even divisions, and include all updates to the program as they occur. This training is outlined in the Civil Rights Division internal Divisional Procedures and the ODOT's annual Title VI Plan.

IV. PROVIDING NOTICE TO LEP PERSONS

Notices of translation and interpretation services are posted at the main entrance and elevators of the Central Office location and all Field Division Headquarter locations. Critical documents are translated into the languages that meet the "Safe Harbor" threshold by the counties in each Field Division and Central Office (Division 9). The Notice of Interpreter Services is in Appendix E.


V. MONITORING AND UPDATING THE LEP PLAN

The LEP Plan will be updated on an as needed basis. A variety of factors can influence the need to update information. There will be a continuous assessment of incoming LEP encounters reported to determine if the needs of any given community have changed. Census data will be analyzed every three years to determine if the eligible populations and languages have changed for the Central Office Division or Field Divisions. There will be annual training of Title VI Designees and each training will include any changes in LEP encounters.

POLICY

THE DEPARTMENT IS COMMITTED TO ENSURING THAT ALL DEPARTMENT SERVICES, PROGRAMS AND ACTIVITIES PROVIDED WITH FEDERAL FUNDING, ARE CONDUCTED IN A NON-DISCRIMINATORY MANNER AND PROTECTS INDIVIDUALS FROM DISCRIMINATION ON THE BASIS OF RACE, COLOR, OR NATIONAL ORIGIN IN ACCORDANCE WITH REGULATIONS OF "TITLE VI OF THE CIVIL RIGHTS ACT OF 1964".

DEFINITIONS

Title VI, Civil Rights Act of 1964 states that "No person in the United States shall, on the grounds of race, color, or national origin be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to, discrimination under any program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance." The Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987 restored the original intent of Title VI and expanded the definition of "program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance" to include ALL programs or activities of a Federal recipient.

Environmental Justice (EJ) (Executive Order 12898) - Defined by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) as, "The fair treatment and meaningful involvement of all people regardless of race, color, national origin, or income with respect to the development, implementation, and enforcement of environmental laws, regulations and policies. Fair treatment means that no group of people, including racial, ethnic, or socioeconomic group, should bear a disproportionate share of the negative environmental consequences resulting from industrial, municipal, and commercial operations or the execution of federal, state, local, and tribal programs and policies."

Federal Assistance - Refers to grants and loans of federal funds; the grant or donation of federal property and interests in property; the detail of Federal personnel; the sale and lease of Federal property; or any Federal agreement, arrangement, or other contract which has one of its purposes as the provision of assistance.

Recipient - Any state, territory, possession, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, or any political subdivision, or instrumentality thereof, or any public or private agency, institution, or organization, or

other entity, or any individual, in any state, territory, possession, the District of Columbia, or Puerto Rico, to whom Federal assistance is extended, either directly or through another recipient, for any program. Recipient includes any successor, assignee, or transferee thereof. The term recipient does not include any ultimate beneficiary under any such program.

Limited English Proficiency (LEP) (Executive Order 13166) - On August 11, 2000, the President signed Executive Order 13166, "Improving Access to Services for Persons with Limited English Proficiency." The Executive Order required Federal agencies to examine the services they provide, identify any need for services to those with limited English proficiency (LEP), and develop and implement a system to provide those services so LEP persons can have meaningful access to them.

(LEP) - Any individual who does not speak English as their primary language and has a limited ability to read, speak, write, or understand English. These individuals may be entitled to language assistance with respect to a particular type of service, benefit, or encounter.

IMPLEMENTATION (SPECIFIC)

The Civil Rights Division is responsible for monitoring the Department's compliance with the Title VI program and for investigating and handling external complaints. Title VI covers:

- 1) All advertisements
- 2) Contracts/subcontracts
- 3) Title VI reports, issues, and complaints; public meetings and internal meetings related to Title VI
- 4) Title VI contract provisions and other legal documents
- 5) Other office areas where discrimination may exist

A. Compliance Reviews

Title VI Compliance Review (23 CFR 200.9(b)(5)) will be conducted on major program areas and sub-recipients to determine the effectiveness of program area activities at all levels and to ensure non-discrimination. All areas are subject to review. Areas under review will be given two weeks' notice along with a copy of the compliance review questions before the on-site visit. A Determination of Findings (DOF) report will be issued after the on-site and a copy will be provided to the Department Director, Title VI Designee, FHWA, and the Civil Rights Division Manager. Areas will be given one week to respond to the DOF. Programs found out of compliance are required to develop a Corrective Action Plan to correct any deficiencies in the DOF within a period

of ninety (90) days as stated in 23 CFR 200.11. Senior staff members will receive a summary of each compliance review and the outcome.

B. Title VI Designees

Each division (if applicable) is required to assign a Title VI designee(s) that is responsible for assisting the Title VI Coordinator to ensure non-discrimination at all levels, programs, and activities within their area(s). Title VI designees are required to submit monthly reports (if applicable) and attend training. Title VI designees assist in identifying and eliminating discrimination at the Department.

C. Limited English Proficiency (LEP)

The Title VI Coordinator is responsible for ensuring that the Department employees know how to assist a LEP individual that comes into contact with any program, activity, or service at the Department. The Title VI Coordinator will conduct a LEP Assessment to identify language barriers, if any, from public individuals that come into contact at any of the nine (9) Department divisions. The Assessment will include the Four Factor Analysis and will be reviewed periodically with the current census to modify any changes.

Please refer to the current LEP Assessment on line for the languages that meet the threshold by division.

All divisions should be conscious of potential language barriers and are responsible for translating their vital document(s) to the required language. All divisions should take into account costs associated with LEP services in their annual budget. As updates are made regarding language barriers, divisions will be notified.

The Department has adopted the Safe Harbor Provisions and determined documents that are considered vital for the public and are to be available in the language(s) that reached the threshold. The current and full list is available at:

Employee Guide Quick Reference Process of Assisting a Limited English Proficient (LEP) Individual

An individual walks in whose primary language is not English:

- What language are they speaking? **Tab 2** can help you determine the language.
- Who can help? First check the ODOT employees in **Tab 3**.
- What if no ODOT employees can help? Check the state contract in Tab 3 (services paid for by your division).
- After the encounter complete form in **Tab 4** within three (3) business days and return to the Title VI Coordinator.

Employee Guide Process of Assisting a Limited English Proficient (LEP) Individual

This document provides guidelines on assisting a Limited English Proficient (LEP) individual that contacts the department for services or requests. This form is also available on the ODOT shared drive at U:\Civil Rt\Title VI\Limited English Proficient (LEP).

LEP – an individual who does not speak English as their primary language, and has a limited ability to read, speak, write, or understand English. These individuals may be entitled language assistance with respect to a particular type of service, benefit, or encounter.

Translation In-Person

- 1. Use the "I Speak" cards located within this packet and ask the individual(s) to point to the language they speak.
- Check the LEP-Interpreter-Translator Database located at <u>U:\Civil Rt\Title VI\Limited English Proficient (LEP)\2019 LEP-Interpreter-Translator.xlsx</u> and contact the individual that speaks the requested language. Check with an ODOT employee first and then go to the state vendor contract.
- 3. When you contact the vendor, the operator can help you identify the language if you need assistance. Provide the vendor with your contact information, department, and the contract information listed on the database sheet. The phone interpreter will ask to speak to the LEP individual and will speak with that person to determine the nature of the request. You may respond through the interpreter and ask follow-up questions of your own. *The cost for the use of a vendor will come from your division's budget*.
- 4. Following the phone conversation, complete the LEP reporting form (within this packet and at <u>U:\Civil Rt\Title VI\Limited English Proficient (LEP)\LEP Reporting Form 2019.pdf</u>) to document the occurrence and how it was resolved.
- 5. Complete and submit the "LEP Reporting Form" within three (3) business days to Katrina Fire, Title VI Coordinator, in the Civil Rights Division or via email at kfire@odot.org.

Translation via Phone

- 1. Place the LEP caller on hold.
- If you <u>can determine the language being spoken</u>, contact an ODOT employee from the LEP-Interpreter-Translator Database located at <u>U:\Civil_Rt\Title VI\Limited English Proficient</u> (<u>LEP</u>)\2019LEP-Interpreter-Translator.xlsx and use the 3-way conference calling process: (over)

Conference calling instructions

- a) Ask the caller to hold.
- b) Press the Xfer button.
- c) Dial the number for the ODOT employee.

You may respond through the interpreter and ask follow-up questions of your own. *The cost for the use of a vendor will come from your division's budget.*

- 3. Following the phone conversation, complete the LEP reporting form (within this packet and at U:\Civil Rt\Title VI\Limited English Proficient (LEP)\LEP Reporting Form 2019.pdf) to document the occurrence and how it was resolved.
- 4. Complete and submit the "LEP Reporting Form" within three (3) business days to Katrina Fire, Title VI Coordinator, in the Civil Rights Division or via email at kfire@odot.org.

Translation for Written Documents

Any incoming correspondence (such as emails, fax, or letters) that requires translation shall be the responsibility of the division receiving the correspondence. For questions contact Katrina Fire, Title VI Coordinator, in the Civil Rights Division. Identified vital documents will be translated as required by the Title VI program.


