Re: Oklahoma Department of Transportation INFRA Grant - I-40 & Douglas Blvd. Interchange

The Association of Central Oklahoma Governments (ACOG) is pleased to support the Oklahoma Department of Transportation's (ODOT) application for funding under the U.S. Department of Transportation INFRA grant program. The proposed project will provide critical and necessary regional transportation improvements in the Central Oklahoma region, including improved access to Tinker Air Force Base, Oklahoma's largest employer and key economic driver for the region.

ODOT's project application includes widening I-40 from four to six through lanes in a five and one-half mile stretch adjacent to Tinker AFB and a reconstructed I-40/Douglas Boulevard interchange to improve transportation safety and traffic and freight access near the base. The widening project will also improve safety by correcting substandard vertical clearances and update infrastructure throughout the corridor.

Much of ACOG's work is focused on developing a regional, multi-modal transportation vision that supports economic growth, enhances livability, and improves the efficiency and safety of the Central Oklahoma transportation network today and into the future, and this important regional project meets all of those objectives. We are hopeful that ODOT's application will be awarded funding to allow these needed and significant transportation improvements to occur in the region.
