The First Americans Museum (FAM) is pleased to support The Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) in its pursuit of fund awards to create a multiuse pedestrian bridge over the Oklahoma River.

First Americans Museum (FAM) is happy to support the effort by the Oklahoma Department of Transportation to create a multimodal pedestrian bridge near downtown Oklahoma City. FAM opened in September 2021 and has received over 200,000 visitors from all 50 states and over 30 countries. A pedestrian bridge crossing the Oklahoma River will allow more access to the museum and the newly announced Horizons District. It will also benefit the greater Oklahoma City community, by making a new pedestrian connection, where there currently is not one. This will allow for the Historically Disadvantaged Communities and Areas of Persistent Poverty south of the river to have new opportunities for employment, education, and healthcare.

Creating another iconic landmark in the Oklahoma City metro area helps create a unique sense of place. The bridge has the power of becoming recognizable at a central and important intersection. Enhancing access to many attractions and businesses near the river will have a significant and positive impact on the Horizons District and economic development along the waterfront, including the OKC Boat House District, Skybridge Park, Bricktown and Deep Deuce.
