FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQ)

US-75 and 141st Street in the City of Glenpool, Tulsa County JP 35120(04)

What is ODOT doing to improve the intersection at US-75 and 141st Street?

ODOT is proposing to improve the interchange by converting the existing at-grade intersection at US-75 and 141st Street in Glenpool, to a grade separated interchange with US-75 over 141st Street. Entrance and exit ramps will be constructed along US-75, providing access to and from 141st Street. Protected turnarounds will be constructed from the US-75 northbound exit ramp to the US-75 southbound entrance and from the US-75 southbound exit ramp to the US-75 northbound entrance ramp.

Will additional right-of-way be acquired for this project?

No additional right-of-way is needed for this interim project. Access to all existing private and commercial properties will be maintained during and after construction.

What if ODOT needs temporary access for construction or a maintenance easement?

Sometimes ODOT will need temporary access or an easement to maintain the highway and drainage structures. Owners will be compensated for temporary right-of-way and for maintenance easements. In these cases, you will maintain ownership of the property. If your property is affected, an ODOT-authorized agent will contact you.

When is construction scheduled to begin?

Construction is anticipated to begin in summer 2024. However, the schedule is dependent on funding and subject to change.

How long will this project take?

The project is estimated to take approximately 1 (one) year.

How will the project be built?

The project construction extents along US-75 will begin approximately a half (½) mile south of W. 141st Street and extend north to approximately a half (½) mile north of W. 141st Street. Service roads, entrance ramps and exit ramps will be constructed first on the east and west sides of US-75 to allow for traffic flow north and south along the construction zone using the service roads. ODOT will construct US-75 over 141st street once traffic has been safely diverted to the services roads within the construction zone.

Will there be access to my private property and property during construction?

Yes, access to homes, businesses, and property adjacent to the project will be maintained during construction. In some cases, temporary drives may be required until permanent drives can be restored.
