

## Before you leave:

- Check car battery, tires, belts, hoses, windshield wipers, brakes and all fluid levels.
- Make sure your vehicle has plenty of fuel; keep your tank at least half full.
- Notify a friend or family member of your planned route and when you expect to arrive.
- Check local weather and weather along your route; be aware of cancellations.
- Keep your cell phone charged. In case of emergency call 911.
- Include a contact number listed as ICE (In Case of Emergency) in your cell phone so emergency personnel can contact a person important to you, in the event you are unable.

- Ice scraper or deicing spray
- Jumper cables
- Clay-based cat litter or sand
- Shovel
- Warm clothes
- Blankets
- High-energy food
- Flashlights with extra batteries
- First aid kit
