Subject: Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) Grant Request for Hochatown Community Access and Pedestrian Safety Project

Dear Secretary,

As the "voice of trucking" in Oklahoma, we represent the unified interest of our member companies that literally have a front row seat to the needs of infrastructure across our state. Having polled our members, the Oklahoma Trucking Association, believes this project meets the desired goals state for the Oklahoma Department of Transportation's (ODOT) application for the Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) grant program. The Hochatown Community Access and Pedestrian Safety Project will expand a section of highway in rural Southeast Oklahoma which has seen substantial growth over the past decade.

Hochatown has become a popular attraction for many across Oklahoma, Arkansas, and Texas. Home to Broken Bow Lake and Beavers Bend State Park, along with numerous other attractions and businesses, this area of Southeast Oklahoma has become a hub for tourism and economic development. The growth has led to the community of Hochatown incorporating in November 2022, establishing a local government for the first time which lacks the resources to develop the highway infrastructure. The existing two-lane highway lacks shoulders and turn lanes which has increased the collision rates and restricts movement. The increased development and tourism have exacerbated the current lack of capacity and the need for major improvements.

The project proposed by ODOT will upgrade a four-mile section of US-259 by expanding the roadway, providing safety and operational improvements, along with improved access management. ODOT also looks to address alternative, multimodal transportation options by providing accessibility through sidewalks and trails. The improved US-259 will help incentivize economic development and sustain the growth that Hochatown has seen in recent years. Construction of the project will create a modernized, safer expanded highway with a shared-use path to support connectivity along the corridor and improve overall conditions for the community and visitors alike.

The Oklahoma Trucking Association strongly supports this project for its vital contribution to the region, state and nation. We urge your support of full funding for the project. Thank you for your consideration of ODOT's application for the application for the RAISE program.
