Oklahoma's unemployment rate increased in July

Oklahoma's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate increased 0.1 percentage point to 3.5 percent in July. The U.S. unemployment rate increased 0.2 percentage point to 4.3 percent in July. Over the year, the state's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 0.3 percentage point higher than July 2023.

Oklahoma nonfarm employment sheds jobs in July

Oklahoma's seasonally adjusted **NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** decreased by 2,300 jobs (0.1 percent) over the month in July 2024. U.S. seasonally adjusted **NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** rose by 114,000 jobs (0.1 percent), in July. Over the year, statewide **NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** added a seasonally adjusted 25,500 jobs (1.5 percent).

- In July, four of Oklahoma's supersectors added jobs, as **Trade, Transportation, and Utilities** (900 jobs) followed by **Other Services** (800 jobs) reported the largest job gains over the month.
- Financial Activities (-2,000 jobs) and Government (-1,800 jobs) posted the largest over-the-month job losses in July.
- Seven of Oklahoma's supersectors reported job gains over the year in July, as Education and Health Services (11,100 jobs) posted the largest gain, followed by Leisure and Hospitality (6,900 jobs).
- **Professional and Business Services** (-3,900 jobs), followed by **Financial Activities** (-1,200 jobs) reported the largest over-the-year job losses in July.
