Proposed Rule, State Plan, and Waiver Amendments

POLICY UPDATES:

To further the agency's commitment to meaningful consultation with Tribal partners, all proposed policy revisions will be provided at the start of the consultation when they are available. An I/T/U public notice advised of the below proposed rule, state plan, and waiver revisions will be issued at least 60 days prior to their submission, but no less than 14 days (limited to abnormal circumstances). The agency strives to keep Tribal partners abreast of any exigent circumstances that may arise and cause timeframes to be updated or shortened.

In addition, the agency's website houses a policy changes blog that is dedicated to Native American Consultation. This <u>blog page</u> allows for comments/questions from providers and members to be submitted to the Agency and become part of the official record. All comments received are considered during the policy making process. The policy updates that are presented during this Tribal Consultation meeting will be officially posted for I/T/U provider and member review during the

 Private Duty Nursing (PDN) Coverage Limitations Change – The Oklahoma Health Care Authority proposes emergency policy revisions to provide families and PDN agencies with the flexibility to staff cases according to the family's need and the member's level of care. Revisions will clarify the criteria for virtual visits when a member is assessed for PDN services. Other policy revisions will change the designated care hours from "per day" to "per week". Language will be amended to reflect maximum hours authorized from 16 hours per day to 112 hours per week. Revisions will also add that a member's medical necessity can be determined by an OHCA physician's appointed designee.

• **Collaborative Care Model Reimbursement** – As directed by Senate Bill 444, the Oklahoma Health Care Authority proposes emergency policy revisions to implement a "Collaborate Care Model" which provides reimbursement for behavioral health and substance use disorder services delivered in a primary care setting. The proposed rule revisions will add "behavioral health integration" as a covered physician's service. The agency is developing medical guidelines that address documentation and limits to ensure proper utilization and billing.

• **Revoke Potentially Preventable Readmissions (PPR) State Plan Pages** – The Oklahoma Health Care Authority seeks to revoke the Potentially Preventable Readmissions (PPR) policy due to low utilization and administrative burden to the agency. With the transition to managed care, the contracted entities may choose to implement similar programs of their own.

 Hospital-Administered Opioid Antagonist Reimbursement – As directed by Senate Bill 712, Oklahoma Health Care Authority will seek federal and state approval to allow the Agency to separately reimburse for opioid antagonists provided to members in an emergency department with symptoms of an opioid overdose, opioid disorder, or any other adverse opioid event related to opioid use.

• Living Choice Timeline Clarification – The Oklahoma Health Care Authority proposes emergency policy revisions to clarify that time a member spends within a skilled nursing facility will be considered when assessing eligibility requirements for Living Choice program applicants. Current policy requires a member to live in a qualifying facility for at least 60 days before applying for Living Choice, but excludes time spent in a skilled nursing facility (SNF) from this 60-day period. This change also aligns OHCA policy with current federal requirements.
