

ANALYSIS OF Hypertension in Oklahoma's SoonerCare Program



SoonerCare Members

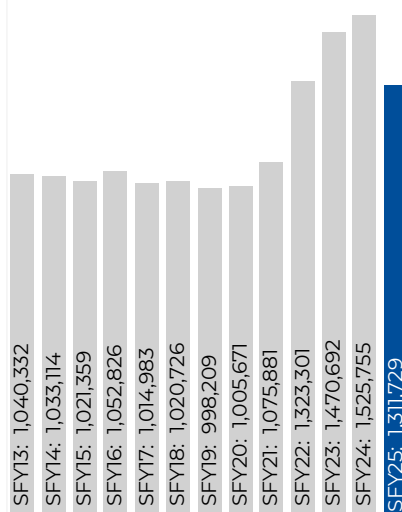
The total number of members diagnosed with hypertension decreased by 5K between SFY24 and 25, but the incidence increased from 9.6% to 10.8% due to a decrease in total enrollment.

The decrease in incidence in SFY24 seems to have been due to underdiagnosis.

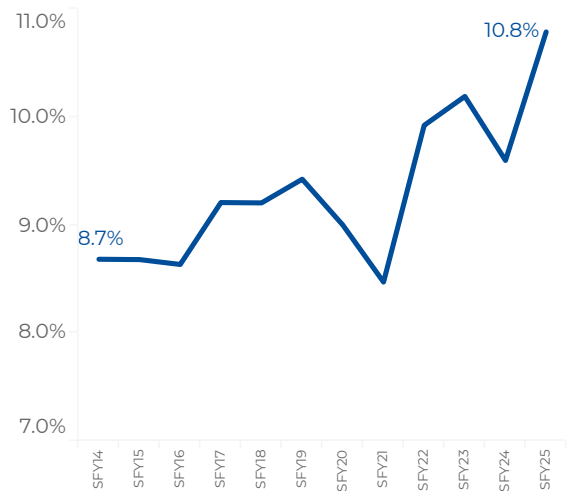

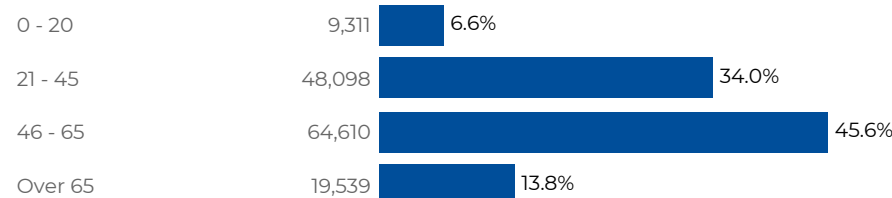
Total SoonerCare Enrollment

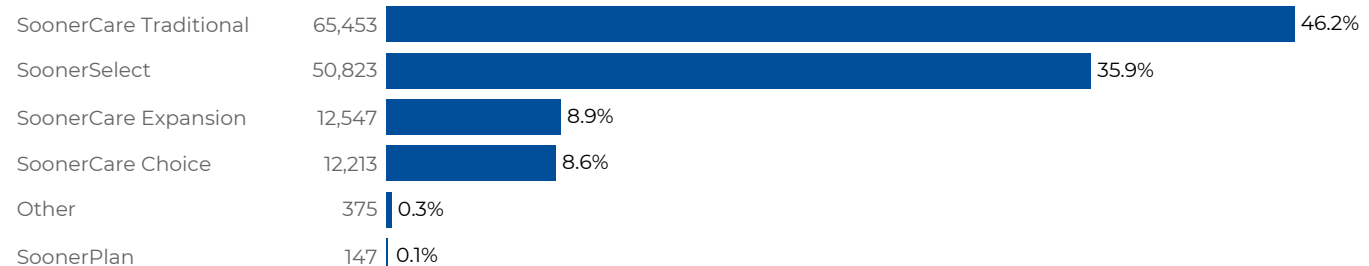
Members with Hypertension by Eligibility Type SFY2025

Members with Hypertension by Delivery System SFY2025

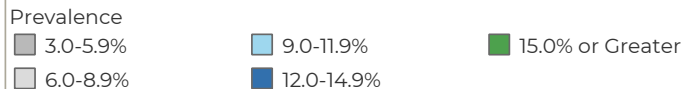

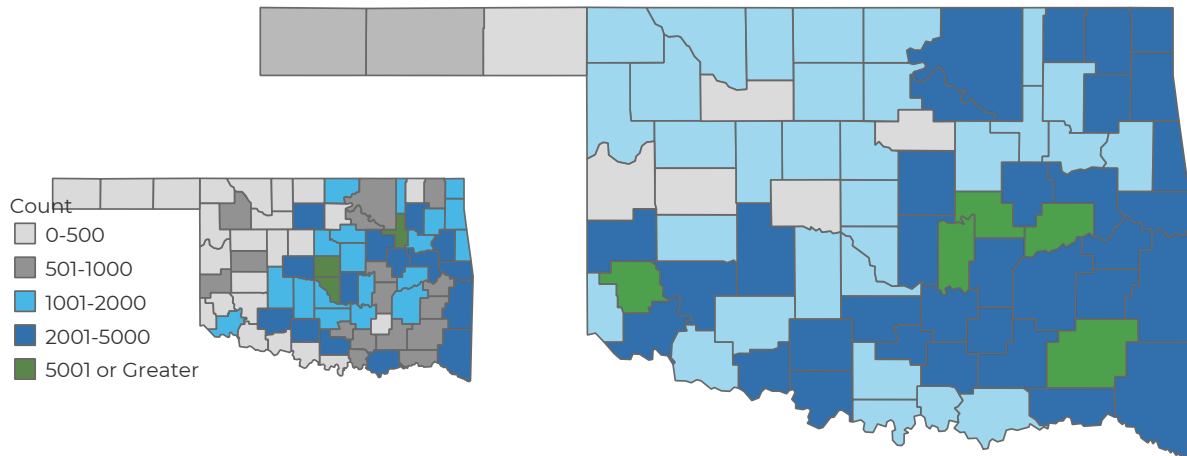
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Prevalence Rates



There appears to be a cluster of hypertension in the southeastern corner of the state, where nearly one in seven members has been diagnosed with hypertension in SFY2025.

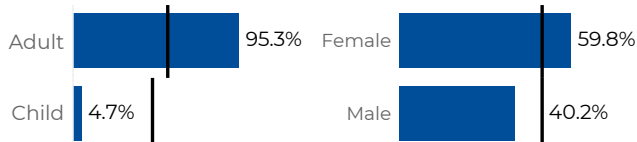


SoonerCare Members with Hypertension

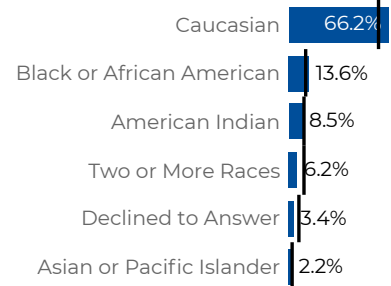

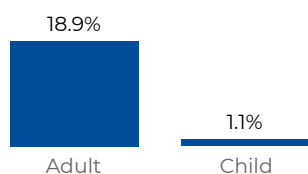

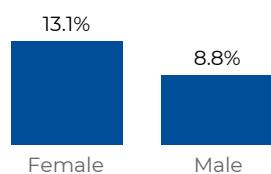

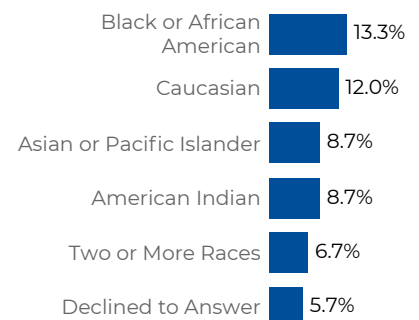

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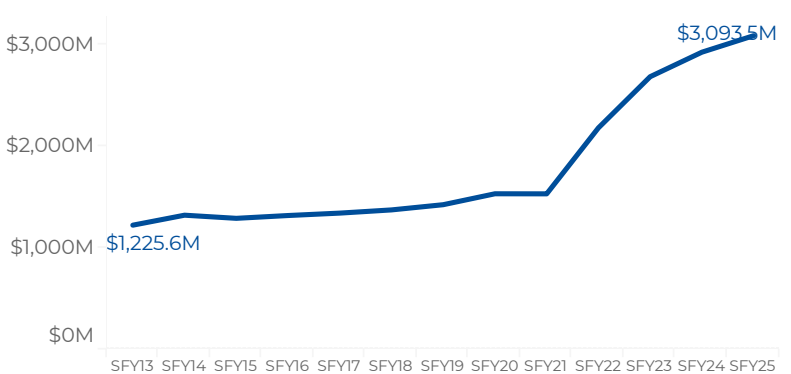


Reimbursement Cost

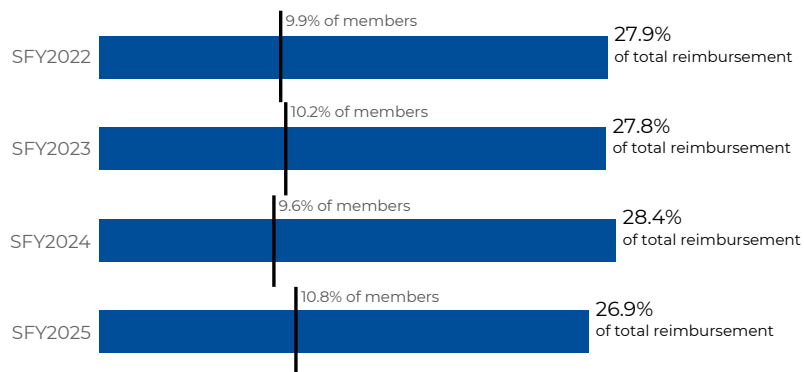
The total reimbursement for services utilized for members with hypertension increased significantly from \$2,931M in SFY2024 to \$3,094M in SFY2025. The per-member average total reimbursement for SFY2025 rose to \$21,857, continuing its upward rise.

Despite a prevalence rate of 10.8%, the total reimbursement for services rendered for SoonerCare members with hypertension made up 26.9% of all reimbursements paid in SFY2025. The cost of providing care to members with hypertension was disproportionately higher than the prevalence of hypertension among SoonerCare members.

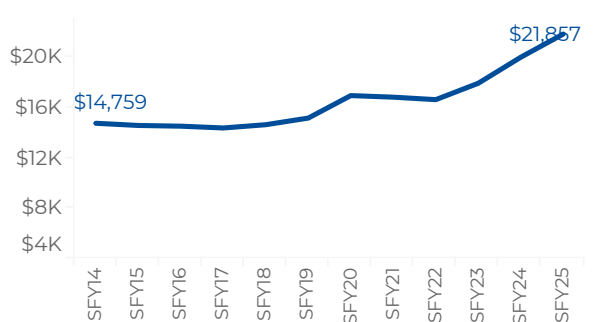
Annual Reimbursement for Members with Hypertension
