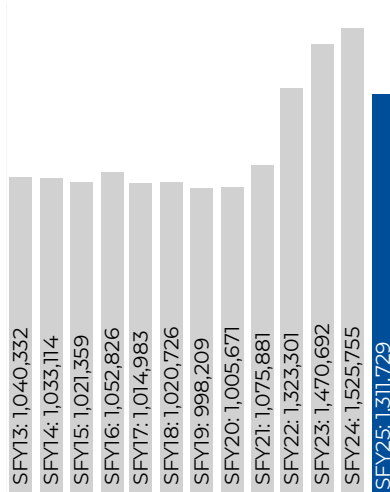
SoonerCare Members

Total members diagnosed with chronic kidney disease (CKD) fell significantly to 45,274 in SFY2025 from 62,463 members in SFY2024. The prevalence also fell slightly from 4.1% to 3.5%. This is still primarily a condition affecting adults.

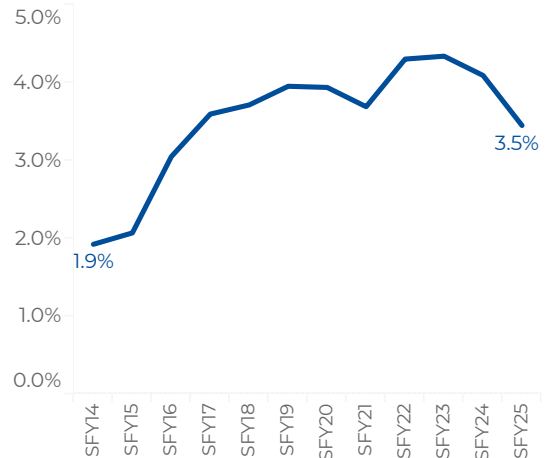

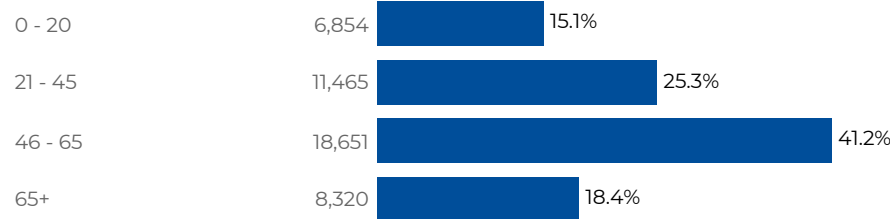
Total SoonerCare Enrollment

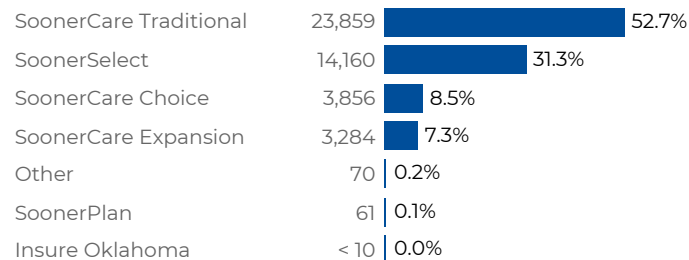
Members with Chronic Kidney Disease by Eligibility Type SFY2025



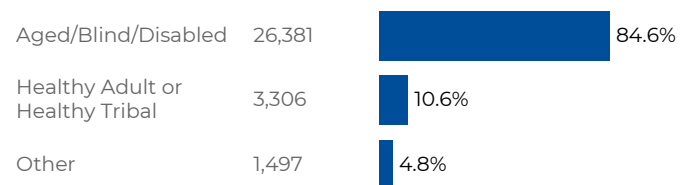

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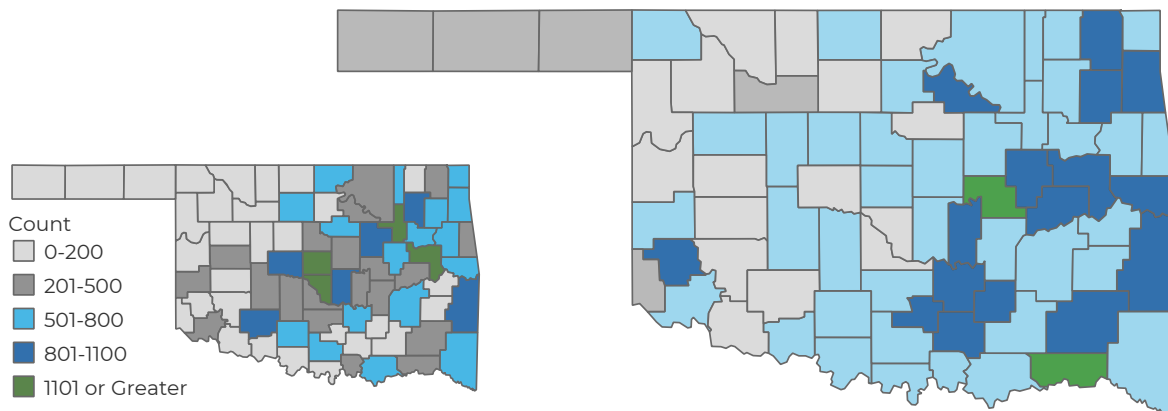


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Prevalence Rates



The eastern region of the state had the majority of counties with a higher prevalence rate of CKD. Okfuskee and Choctaw have the highest prevalence at above 6%.

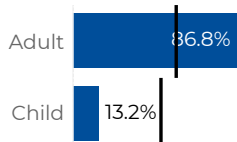


SoonerCare Members with Chronic Kidney Disease

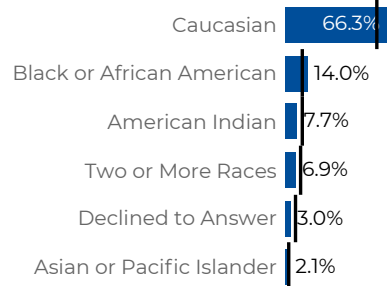

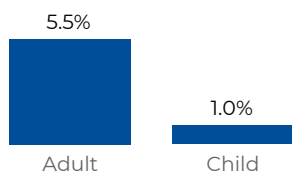

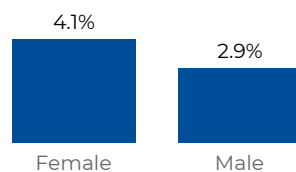

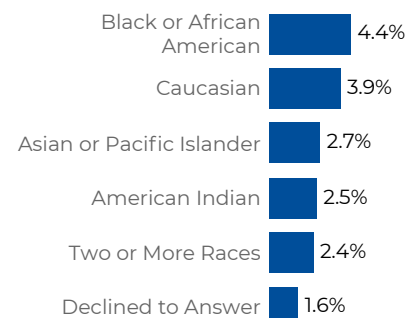

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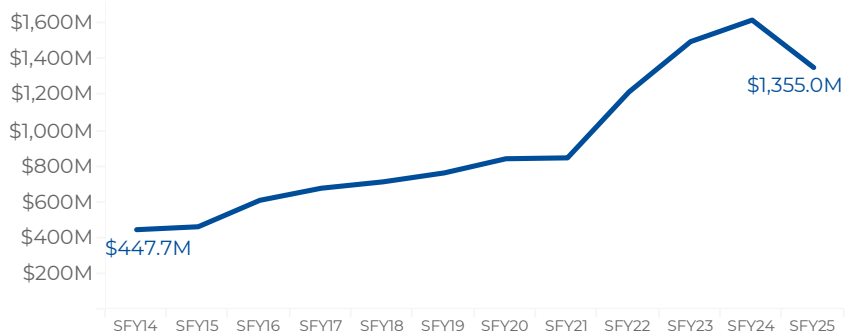
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Reimbursement Cost

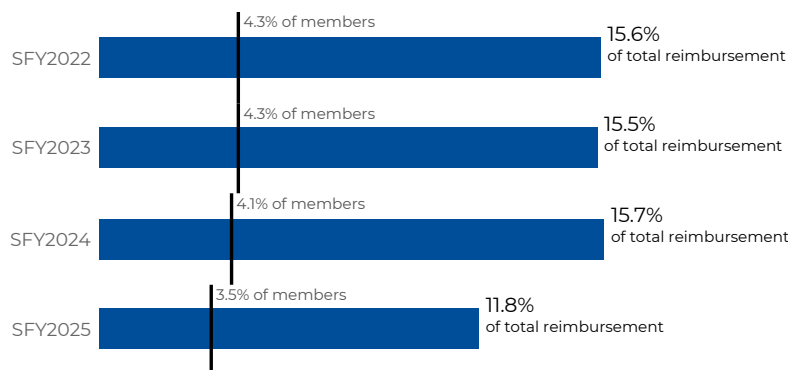
The total reimbursement for members with CKD fell significantly from \$1,621M in SFY2024 to \$1,355M in SFY2025. The total reimbursement for members with CKD in SFY2024 made up 11.8% of all reimbursements paid in SFY2024, despite members with CKD comprising 3.5% of all SoonerCare members.

Per-member reimbursements have continued to rise since SFY2017.

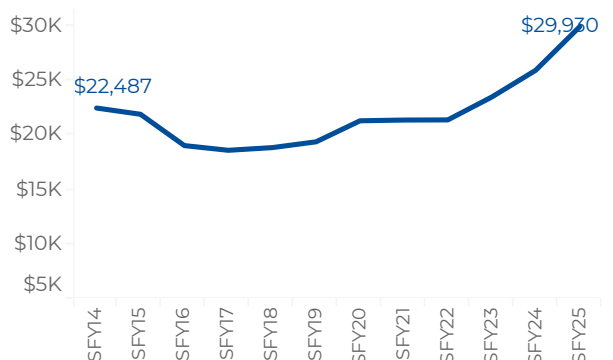
Annual Reimbursement for Members with Chronic Kidney Disease
