



State Fiscal Year is defined as the period between July 1 and June 30 of each fiscal year. BCC is the acronym for Oklahoma Cares (Breast and Cervical Cancer coverage) and FP is SoonerPlan (Family Planning) members. TEFRA is included in the OTHER category.

OHCA and OSU-OKC launch Certified Nurse's Aide Training

The Oklahoma Health Care Authority (OHCA) and OSU-Oklahoma City, in collaboration with various state agencies, will once again offer a certified nurse aide training program.

The classes are scheduled to begin the week of July 31st. For people who qualify, the program will be available at no cost. It has been expanded to include Oklahoma, Logan, Canadian and Cleveland county residents who earn certification and gain employment at a Medicaid long term care facility for at least 12 months. Students will be required to pay for an OSBI background check as well as TB testing.

OSU-OKC will provide curriculum designed to prepare students to complete the state's nurse aide competency examination. The curriculum consists of 80 hours of training including 16 hours of supervised clinical training. Students will also be required to pass an Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigations background check and nurse aide registry screening prior to beginning training.

The CNA training program was piloted beginning in the summer of 2005 to residents of Oklahoma and Logan counties. During the pilot project, approximately 300 Oklahomans received their CNA certification. OHCA staff, along with other agencies, studied various outcomes related to the effectiveness of the program, made improvements, and expanded the program to two additional counties, Cleveland and Canadian.
