Eligibility for Psychosocial Rehabilitation Services — Outpatient behavioral health rules are amended to add additional eligibility criteria required in order to receive psychosocial rehabilitation (PSR) services. Adult PSR services will be limited to members with a history of psychiatric hospitalization or admissions to crisis centers; have been determined disabled by the Social Security Administration for mental health reasons; or who are residing in residential care facilities. Children's PSR services will be limited to members with a history of psychiatric hospitalization or admissions to crisis centers; have been determined disabled by the Social Security Administration for mental health reasons; or have a current Individual Education Plan (IEP) for emotional disturbance. Narrowing the eligibility criteria for PSR services comports with the Federal definition of rehabilitative services found in 42 CFR 440.130(d) which defines them as "any medical or remedial services recommended by a physician or other licensed practitioner of the healing arts...for maximum reduction of physical or mental disability and restoration of a beneficiary to his best possible functional level." Without the recommended revisions, ODMHSAS is at risk of exhausting its State appropriated dollars required to maintain the State's Medicaid Behavioral Health Program.

Estimated SFY 2015 Budget Impact: Savings to ODMHSAS of \$54,322,344 Total; \$20,479,524 State

Limit on outpatient behavioral health provider billable hours – ODMHSAS in collaboration with OHCA is exploring revisions to SoonerCare Outpatient Behavioral Health rules that would limit the number of weekly billable hours for all outpatient behavioral health providers to 40 hours. Without the recommended revisions, ODMHSAS is at risk of exhausting its State appropriated dollars required to maintain the State's Medicaid Behavioral Health Program

Estimated annual Budget Impact: Savings to ODMHSAS of \$8,500,000 Total; \$3,204,500 State.

Prior Authorizations for Partial Hospitalization – ODMHSAS in collaboration with OHCA is exploring reducing the authorization period for members in Partial Hospitalization from 90 days to 60, 45 or 30 days. Without the recommended change to utilization management procedures for this level of care, ODMHSAS is at risk of exhausting its State appropriated dollars required to maintain the State's Medicaid Behavioral Health Program.

Estimated annual budget impact: Savings to ODMHSAS of \$2,067,394 Total; \$770,518 State.

Provider Rate Reduction – For every 1% in provider rate reductions, ODMHSAS would save \$1,024,677 in state appropriated dollars for the Medicaid Behavioral Health Program.
