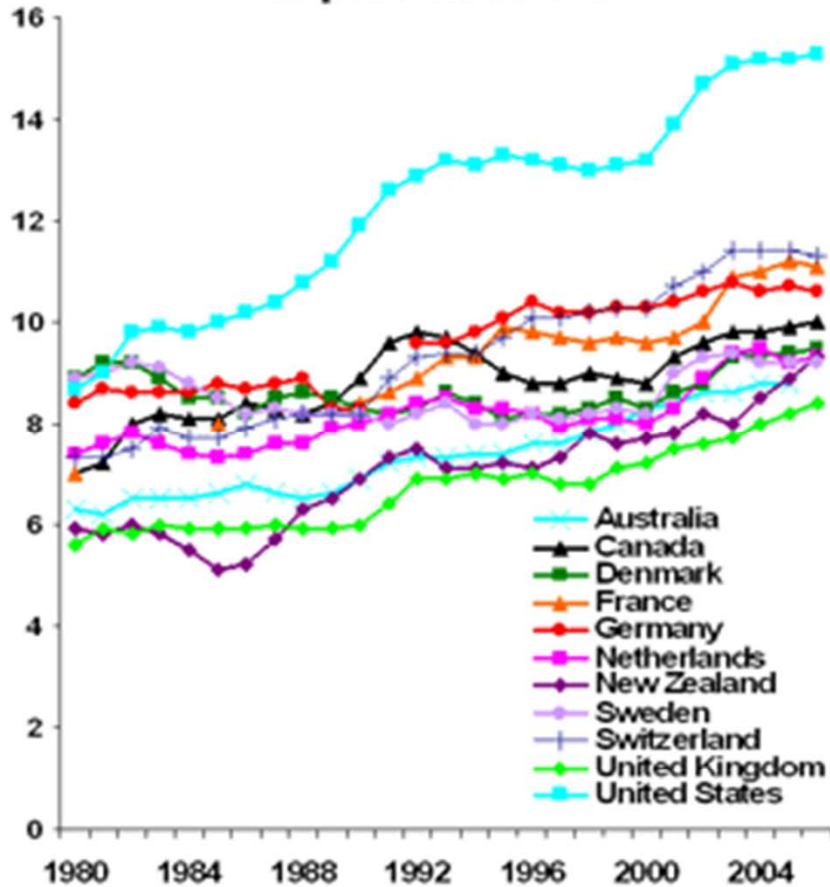

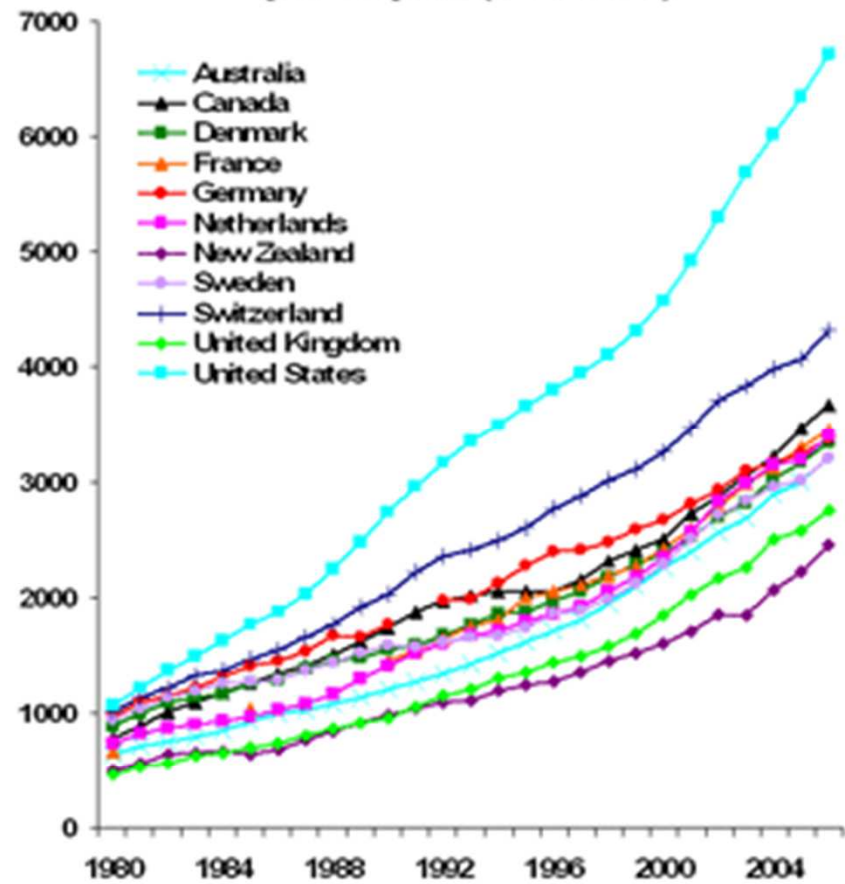
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# International Comparison of Spending on Health, 1980-2006

**Total expenditures on health as percent of GDP**



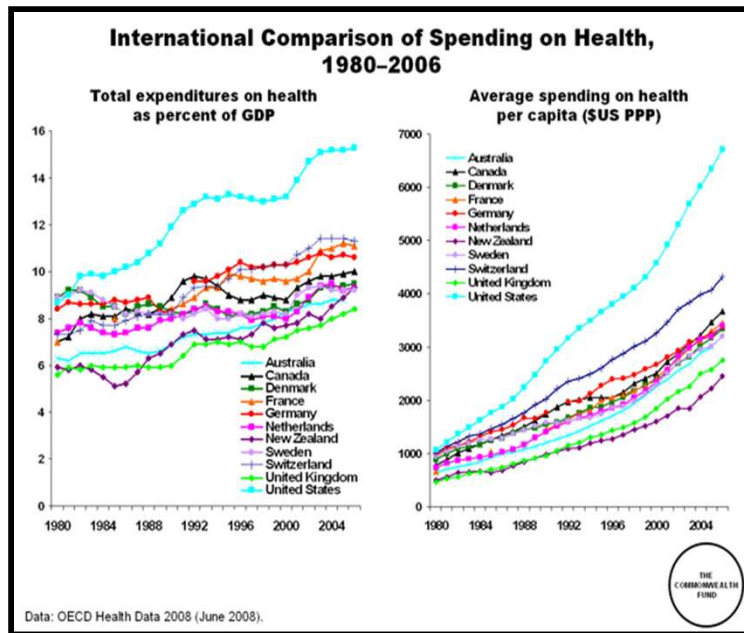
**Average spending on health per capita (\$US PPP)**

- Uninsured

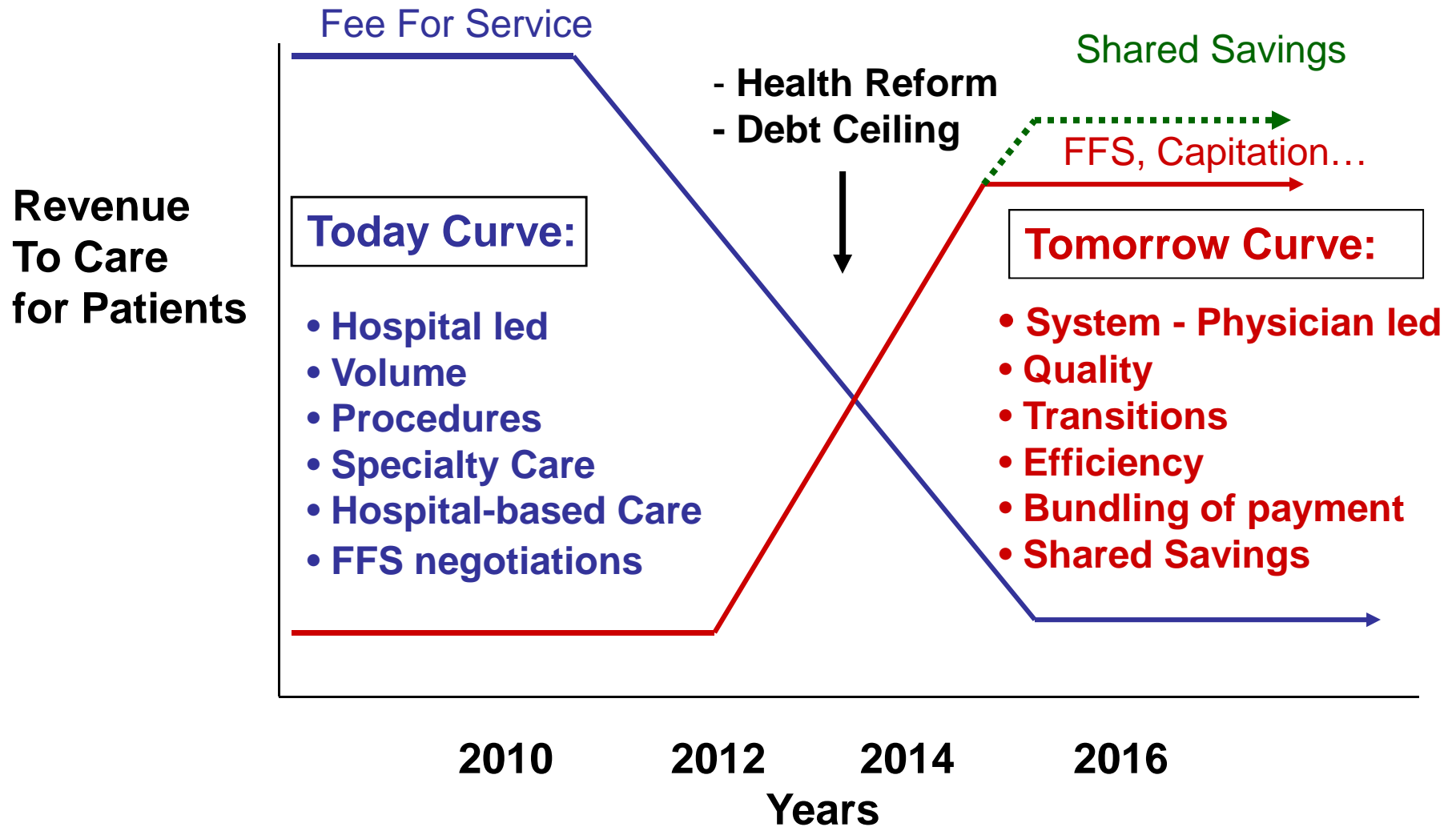

# One Piece at a Time: OU in Tulsa

## Tulsa Health Innovation Zone Planning



1. EMR implementation – 2004
  - Same EMR across entire multispecialty practice
2. Health Workforce
  - Physician Assistant program expansion and Teaching Health Centers- primary care residency training at Federally Qualified Health Centers
  - Integrate new education programs around access, quality, safety and efficiency of care starting at student levels.
  - Promote Altruism
3. Team Care
  - Patient Centered Medical Home payment from OHCA for primary care, severe mental illness, pediatric diabetes, palliative care
4. Care Coordination 
  - Partnership with OHCA for patient navigation, attention to outcomes and performance, web-based consultation .
5. High Cost Patient Pilot – Duals Planning Pilot
  - Pilot with CMS and OHCA for Mini ACO for Medicare – Medicaid high cost patients
6. Regional Health Information Exchange
  - One of 15 across US - \$ 12,000,000 infrastructure grant (MyHealth)
7. OU – Tulsa team to Dartmouth Master's In Health Science Delivery
  - Focused training on next generation of health care systems
8. LEAN grant from US Dept of Labor
  - Toyota LEAN strategies in health care, streamline administrative and care processes.
