# SOONERCARE SILVER DUAL ELIGIBILITY DEMONSTRATION PROJECT:

- Increased quality of care and care coordination
- Improved array of behavioral health services, merging different treatment options
- Synergizing input from members and stakeholders



# Programs of All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly (PACE)

- The PACE program is a unique capitated managed care benefit for the frail elderly provided by a non-for-profit or public entity.
- The PACE program features a comprehensive medical and social service delivery system using an interdisciplinary team approach in an adult day health center that is supplemented by in-home referral services in accordance with participants' needs.
- PACE enrollees must be at least 55 years old, live in the catchment area of a PACE center, able to live safely and independently in the community at the time of enrollment and must be certified for nursing home level of care.



#### TULSA'S HEALTH INNOVATION ZONE /ACO

An Accountable Care Organization (ACO) is a network of doctors and hospitals that shares responsibility for providing care to patients.
