A. Roll Call:

C. Report on the September 8, 2022, special meeting of the Capitol – Medical Center Improvement and Zoning Commission:

Mr. Jones reported that the zoning commission approved several permits, including a demolition permit to demolish a garage at 808 NE 17th Street owned by Patrick and Karolina Roberts. They also approved a building permit for an addition to the back of a house at 917 NE 17th Street owned by Sergio Diaz. Finally, the Commission approved a public art sculpture for the Capitol View Neighborhood Association at 900 NE 29th Street, which is used as a community garden and butterfly waystation.

D. <u>Discussion and possible action to make recommendations to the Capitol – Medical Center Improvement and Zoning Commission concerning items on the commission's September 23, 2022, meeting agenda:</u>

1. Discussion and possible action regarding BP-22-23-5, request by Chad Bullock, GS Sign Services, for a building permit for construction of illuminated building-mounted signs for the Oklahoma History Center at 800 Nazih Zuhdi Drive in Oklahoma City:

The applicant proposes to construct illuminated building-mounted signs in three locations of the Oklahoma History Center. The proposed signs would draw more attention to the History Center and Capitol Complex and make it more welcoming to visitors. The building does not currently feature any signage.

Staff recommended approval of BP-22-23-5, with the finding that the proposed work complies with applicable zoning rules.
