5. Presentation and possible discussion of update on the AE-1:

Ms. Milburn introduced Duane Mass and announced Mass Architects, the firm that was awarded the contract to serve as the Architect Engineer 1 (AE-1) for the Jim Thorpe Building renovation project. The contract was executed on November 14, 2022, for \$850 thousand for one percent of the project.

6. Presentation and possible discussion of tenant relocation update:

Ms. Milburn updated the members on the Jim Thorpe Building (JTB) tenant's temporary relocations. The Oklahoma Arts Council selected space on the first floor of the Agriculture Building. OMES is currently trying to find permanent storage for the Attorney General, which has storage space in the JTB. OMES is meeting with the Corporation Commission to review space needs and options. Troop R (DPS) is considering space at the state Capitol. The Election Board is considering a permanent move out of the JTB to the Will Rogers Building or the Connors Building basement space. OMES Human Capital Management will relocate to alternate training spaces, and the American Legion (not-for-profit) is considering state and private options.

OMES' goal is to relocate the tenants around March 1, 2023.

Ms. Milburn updated the members on OMES's preliminary timeline of the project.
