The State Use program, established by Oklahoma statute and administered by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services (OMES), aims to provide long-term employment opportunities and job training for individuals with disabilities. The program partners with qualified nonprofit agencies (QNAs) to supply a range of products and services to state agencies.
